Rebel runners shoot for gold at OFSAA championship

A number of Georgetown District High School runners are in Toronto today (Saturday) to compete in the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Associations cross country meet at High Park.

Four teams from GDHS qualified for the OFSAA final after they finished in the top two schools in their respective divisions at the Golden Horseshoe Athletic Conference meet last week.

The Midget boys' team from GDHS remained undefeated in team competition as they took top honors at the GHAC meet. Meanwhile, the Junior and Senior teams from the school both placed second, to give GDHS the overall boys' championship title at the meet.

The Midget girls' team placed second, a mere two points behind Westvale of Hamilton, Sara Mulholland paced the Georgetown runners in the Midget girls' event with a third-place finish, followed by Kim Barr in fifth, Megan Lusby in sixth, and Kim Mizener in 16th. Jenny Ryan also ran in the Midget division, and was 25th. The top four runners from each school constitute the team.

Four GDHS runners placed in the top 10 in the Midget boys' event, to give them the team championship with a combined score of 23. Paul Lalonde was third, Kevin Tanas was fifth, Steve Holmes placed sixth, and

Michael Kinnon was minth Kevin Euwen also ran for GDHS.

The Junior boys' team from Georgetown placed second, just one point behind the lough Westvale runners. Bob Danker placed second in the race, Martin Davidson was ninth, David Scida was toth and Rich Bond completed the team total with a 16th place finish. Glen Mulder, also of GDHS, was 20th.

Dave Paul took top honors in the Senior boys' event, to lead the GDHS team to a second place finish, one point behind Milton District High School. Sean Cleary was third, Rick Lane was 14th, Paul Tufford was 16th, and Jeff Amato was 19th in the Senior division.

The Senior girls' team from GDHS was third overall, and Tara Bouskill, who finished eighth in the race, qualified as an individual alternate

The close finishes for the Junior and Senior boys and the Midget girls in team competition at GHAC left many of the runners secondguessing themselves, according to coach Donna Metcalfe.

"A one-point loss, or even a twopoint loss is difficult to take," Metcalle says. "Everyone is thinking 'If I'd only passed one more runner But I think it makes them a bit more determined, heading to OFSAA."

In their opening game, GDHS doubled Milton District High School 4-2, earlier in the week ...


The Rebels start their regular schedule Tues, Nov. 24 Home games are being played Tuesday afternoons at Aicott Arena. In an exhibition match, the






