Halton basketball champs

Rebels win a 'barnburner'

Moe Leeking has smudged the reputation of his alma mater, and he's not sorry one little bit.

Tuesday, Leeking guided his GDHS Senior Rebels to their first-ever Halton basketball championship title, and he did it in the hallowed halls of Nelson High School, where just a few decades ago he walked as a student.

The Rebels fought off a late charge by the Nelson Lady Lords to win the championship game 55-54, in a showdown that lived up to its billing.

"It was a good old-fashioned barnburner," Leeking said following the game. "It's too bad we only play each other once. It was a lot of fun."

Leeking admitted there was a certain amount of incentive for him, going against his former high school. At the same time, many of his players had suffered defeat at the hands of Nelson last year, when the two teams clashed for the junior championship.

Georgetown enjoyed a 14-point lead heading into the final quarter but were hard-pressed by the Lady Lords as they were outscored 23-10 in the final period.

The game began tentatively, and there was cause for concern when Rebel sharpshooter Lisa Mason missed two close-in shots early on. But Mason eventually settled down and finished the game with eight points.

Jenny Melville did a good job in-

side for the Rebels, and finished the game with 12 points, most of which came from cashing in on rebounds.

Georgetown began to open up their lead in the second quarter, and by the half were out front 31-23.

With Georgetown leading 45-31 at the three-quarter mark, Nelson went to the full court press with about six minutes left in regulation time.

The move paid off as the Lady Lords managed to tie up the Rebels and force some poor passes.

Nelson was within six when guard Meagan Dougherty hit a 25-footer to close the difference to 55-51.

With 45 seconds left Tara Bur-

roughs of the Rebels was forced to foul Dougherty as she was going in for a lay-up. Dougherty made one of her two free throws to make it 55-52.

Then, with 29 seconds remaining Nelson centre Anna Gabler scored from inside to bring the Lady Lords to within one, but that was as close as they would get as the Rebels managed to mix things up, and keep Nelson from getting the ball down court.

Besides Melville, Allison Irvine clicked for 12 points for the Rebels. Other scorers included Heather Lawrence with 10, Burroughs with nine, and Shanna Long with four.

The Lady Lords were paced by Gabler's 16 points, while Dougherty had 14. Heather Rollo and Noelle Bethea each had 10, and Nancy O'Neil added four.

Leeking had high praise for Melville following the game.

"She's the captain and leader in every way," he said. "She does everything a coach could dream of."

Both the Lady Lords and the Rebels were undefeated in league play heading into the title game.

The Rebels now advance to the OFSAA "AA" finals which will be held in Chatham, early in December.

Former Toronto Maple Leaf Billy Harris will also be a head table guest, and will give a slide presentation and speak on Leafs of Yesterday.

As is usually the case in Georgetown, there is no telling who else might show up for the dinner, according to Kentner.

The members of the Georgetown Gemini hockey team will be there, as well.

Kentner says tickets have been selling well for the event, and he is expecting over 100 people. Dinner is scheduled for 7:30 p.m., with a social hour preceding at 6:30 p.m.

Kentner says a committee is being formed to take over the reins in organizing future dinners, and it will be headed by Halton Hills director of Recreation and Parks Tom Shepard.

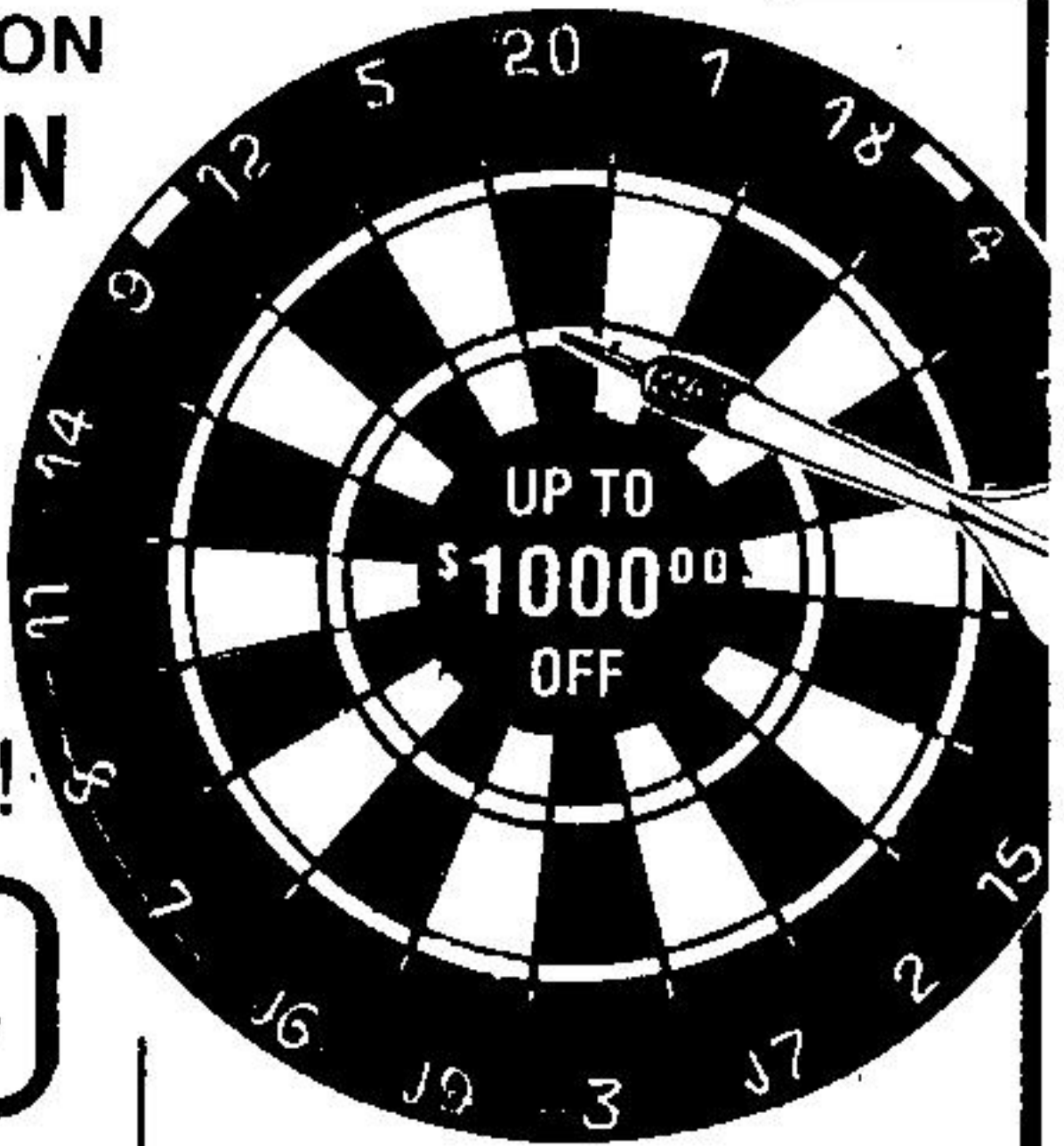
