Junior volleyball champions

Rebels claim third straight title

The Georgetown District High School Rebels made Halton sports history Wednesday, when they won an unprecedented third straight Halton junior volleyball championship crown.

In a match that featured several momentum shifts, the Rebels downed the pesky Assumption Secondary School Crusaders 15-11, 15-13, 8-15, 15-6.

For Georgetown coach Bob McKay, it was the culmination of what was expected to be a rebuilding season.

"We went in today with the youngest team I've coached," McKay said following the victory. "This one feels pretty good."

The Crusaders were an upstart team from the Halton West division, who finished third, but proceeded to knock off the East's second place Bishop Reding Royals, and the West's top team Lester B. Pearson en route to the final showdown.

Crusaders' coach Debbie Lamparski was disappointed with the championship defeat, but pleased with her team's season, overall.

"I'm really proud of the team," she said. "It was a great season. They (the Rebels) were just better today. They hit better, and blocked better."

One of the main turning points of the match was when the Crusaders led 13-9 in the second game, but watched as the Rebels came back to take a 15-13 decision. "The killer instinct just wasn't there," Lamparski said.

McKay feels the major turning point came in the fourth game. Assumption had tied the game at five, but were penalized a point for serving out of rotation, and service went over to the Rebels. "It was a case of double jeopardy," said McKay.

Trent Cull had an excellent game at the net for the Rebels, particularly in the late going. McKay expects great things from the Grade 9 student as he continued to mature.

Jonathan King was the big man at the net for the Crusaders with a number of quality kills and defensive blocks. But the Rebels adjusted

to neutralize the Assumption attacker.

"They had two or three kids who could put the ball down hard," said McKay. "But when they brought him (King) up the middle, we adjusted our defence to put a triple

block on him. That way he had to go to a tip game."

For the Junior Rebels, next season looks promising as well.

Only three players, Marc Murnaghan, Sean Cotton, and Travis Gardiner, will move up to Senior competition due to age.

Peewees lose 7-2 to Orangeville

The Georgetown "AA" Peewees dropped a 7-2 decision to a swift-skating Orangeville team, last Thursday at Memorial Arena.

The visitors were led by Derek Jupling, who scored three goals and added two assists for a five-point night.

The game was tied at one late in the first period after Jupling scored his first for Orangeville, and Kenny Kosziwka replied for Georgetown.

Orangeville then added two goals to their total in the final three minutes of the period, giving them a 3-1 lead.

In the second period, the visitors scored two more goals, while the

locals responded with one, by Andrew Elliott.

For Elliott, it was his second point of the game after he assisted on the Kosziwka goal. Tim Presswood also had a two-point night, assisting on both Georgetown goals.

The third period belonged to Orangeville, as they scored their final two goals to put the game out of reach.

Marc St. Pierre, hard-pressed in the Georgetown net, made several outstanding saves to keep the score from climbing any higher than it did.

The next home game for the Peewee squad is Sunday, when they entertain Stoney Creek
