What's the latest in fun and games?

If you're thinking about buying a game or toy for a child or adult, Jeff Conrad can tell you what's in and what's out. He's the game designer for International Games, Inc., manufacturer of the best-selling card game UNO and other family and children's games and toys.

The toy industry works like a pencalum. It's cyclical," Conrad comments. "I compare it to the fashion industry. The length of a woman's skirt and the width of a man's tie change every year, but they always end up repeating themselves."

Conrad, a game designer for 17 years, says that a 1970s trend is back. with a little twist: Crafts are popular again. Today's crafts, however, are activity products that offer instant gratification, rather than projects that require numerous steps and lots of time.

For example, Stampos Activity Sets, by International Games, let children create scenes and pictures using self-inking rubber stampers. Conrad says that parents and children want to create something and see the result -

"The older crafts, such as threading a needle through a cardboard picture of an animal, took time. Today's activity sets give children immediate results," Conrad explains.

Several activity toys have become popular with children. With Magna Doodle, by the Ideal Co., children use a special tool to draw pictures on a screen filled with a metallic substance. This material is attracted to the tool and brought to the surface of the screen. The result is a picture that can be erased immediately. The Etcha-Sketch Animator, by Ohio Art, uses a screen on which a child draws a dozen pictures. When the screens are "animated" in sequence, they create a moving picture.
