Photoart '88 is a photography contest open to all residents of Halton Hills. Each participant is asked to enter no more than six photos, and no less than four. A handling fee of \$1.50 will be charged for each photo.

Photographers are asked not to frame their photos, but, mount them on white board with a 3" margin around the photograph. Use adhesive that does not distort the mat. The photographs have to be signed in pencil by the photographer on the white board below the right hand corner of the photograph.

The photographs must not be smaller than 5" x 7" and no larger than 16" x 12". Colour and black and white photographs will be accepted, but not polaroid photographs.

The last day of entry is Saturday, February 20, 1988. The jury will consist of Paul Savoie, Bill Scanlon, and James Virgin. The decision of the judges will be final.

All selected photographs will be exhibited in the Gallery of the Halton Hills Library and Cultural Centre from March 2 to March 27. Awards will be given on the photographs of the best photographs in the exhibition.

For sale purposes, the value of each photograph must be written on the back of the mounted photograph, together with the name, address and phone number of the photographer, as well as relevant data concerning the photograph. The Halton Hills Library and Cultural Centre will take a 25 per cent commission on sold photographs. Without a receipt from the Library and Cultural Centre, no responsibility will be taken for lost or damaged entries.

All photographs not selected for the exhibition must be picked up at the Cultural Centre between February 24 and 27. Works not picked up will be disposed of after March 31.
