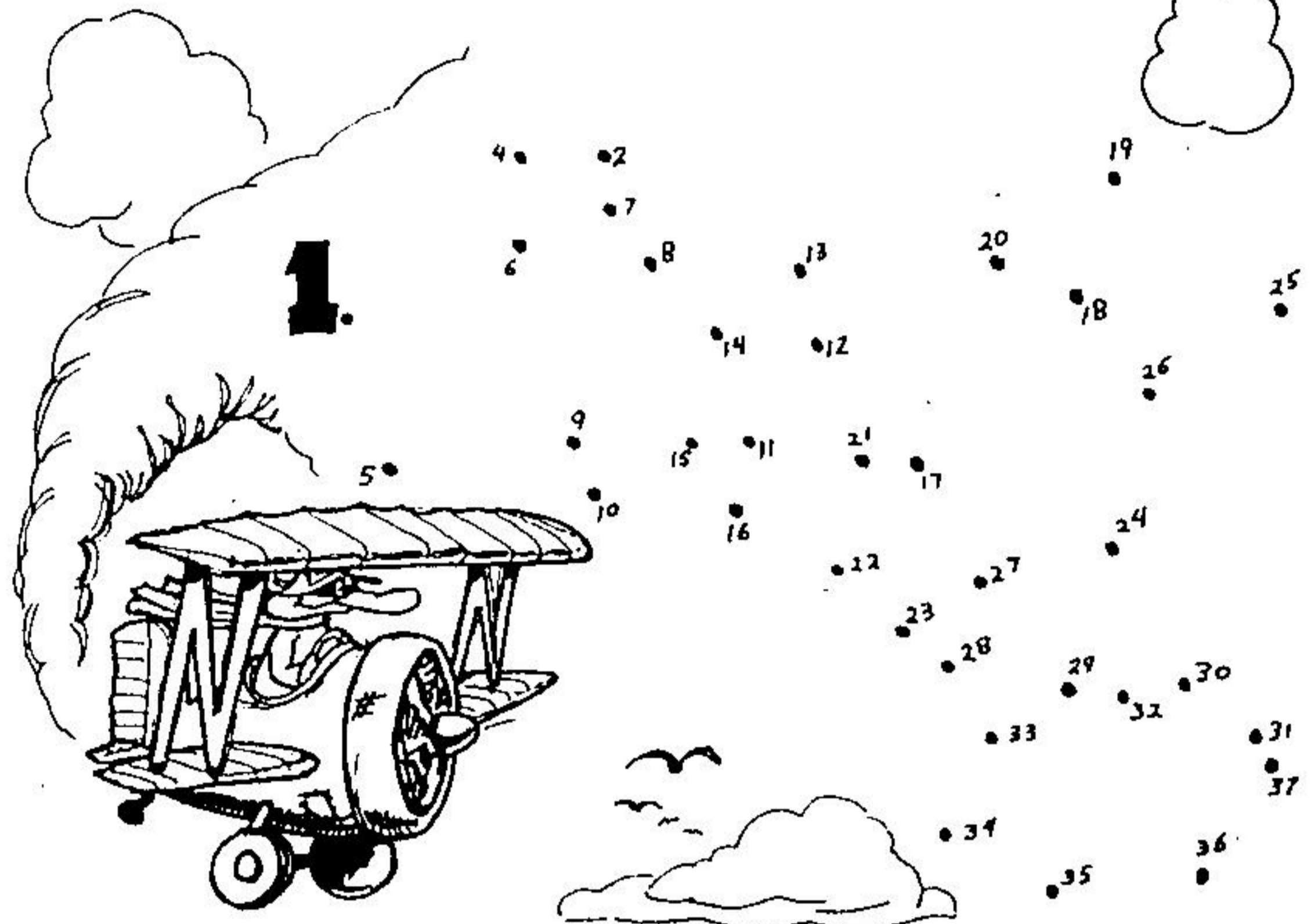
## UP, UP & AWAY

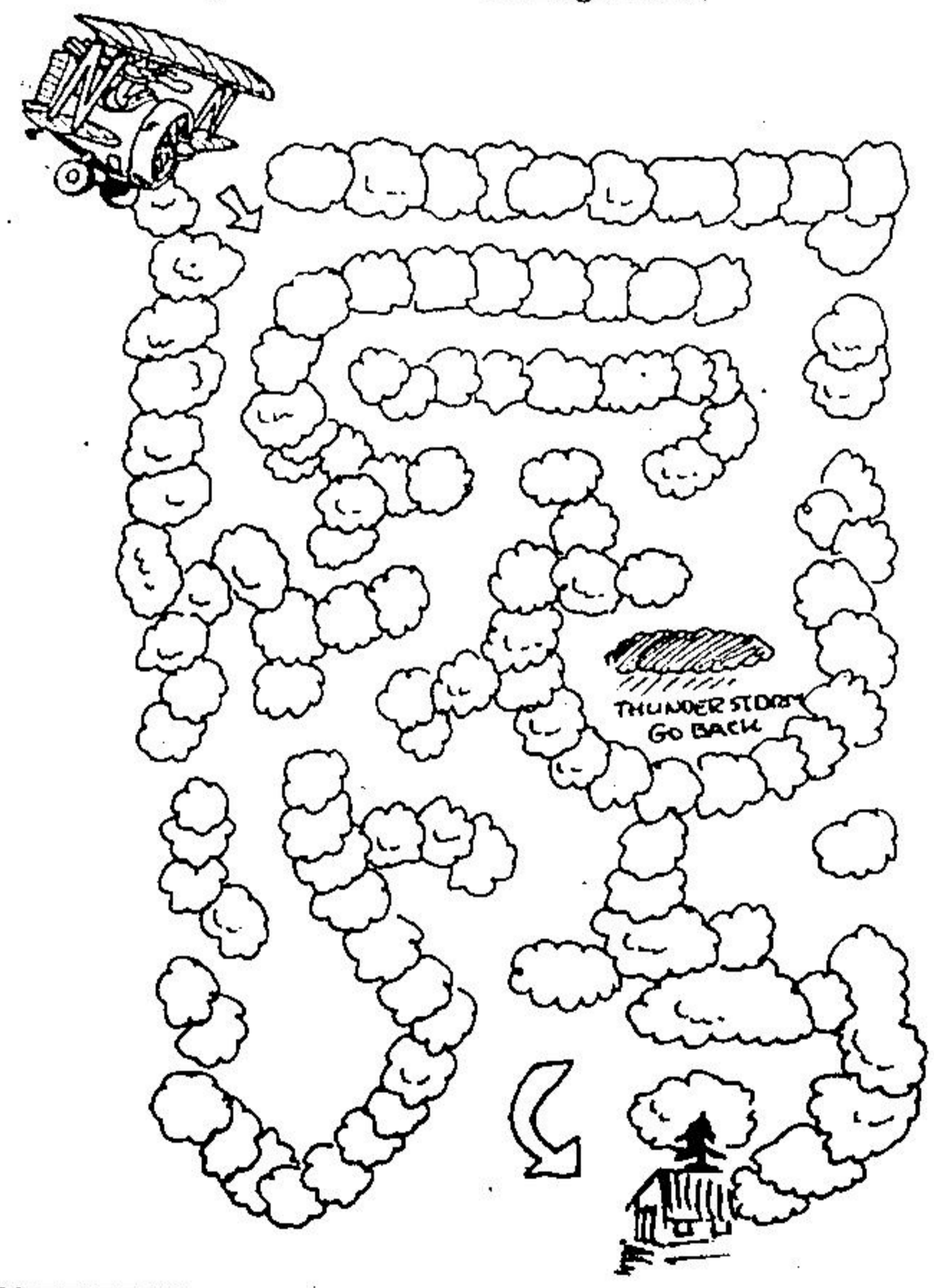
# ZOOM!

## TRICKY TRAIL

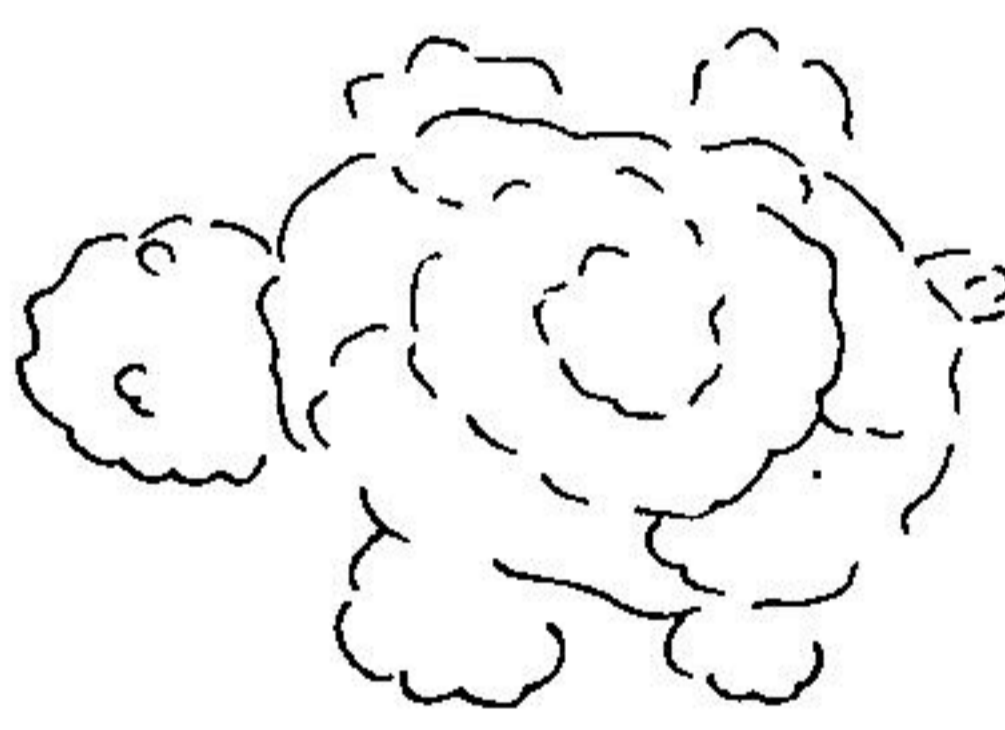
Alfie Alligator would like to go home, but he has lost his way in the clouds. Can you help Alfie find the best route through the clouds so that he can get home?

### BOOKS

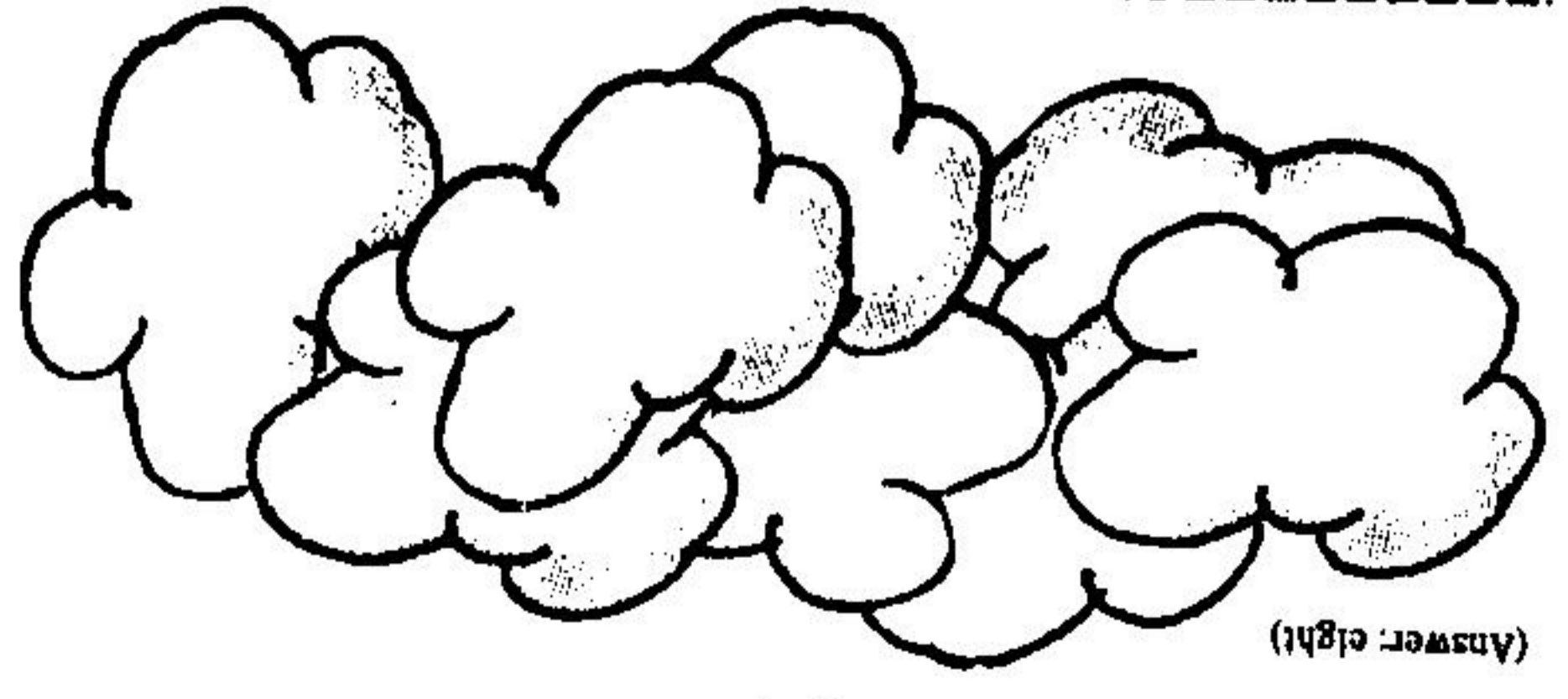
