

Johnson atoms outgunned in play at Cracker tourney

The Johnson and Associates Major Atom B team participated in the Oak Ridges Christmas Cracker Tournament, last weekend. Although failing to win a game, they played well, and generally seemed to enjoy the experience.

The locals were grouped with Kingston, Oshawa and Richmond Hill in the round-robin elimination, with the winner advancing to the final.

In their opening game against Kingston, a pair of penalties, combined with a potent Kingston power play, started Georgetown on their way to a 7-0 defeat. Until then, Georgetown had kept the strong Kingston attack off the scoresheet. But after the second power play goal made the score 3-0, at 7:38 of the second period, the locals sagged, and Kingston popped in two more in two minutes, to put the game away.

The second game was against an Oshawa team whose supporters claimed to be better than their AA team. From this one game, that seemed entirely possible, as they dominated Johnson and Associates, out-shooting them 45-1, and out-scoring them 10-0.

The third game was against Richmond Hill Select Acoustics. The locals played a strong game, out-shooting the opposition 15-13, and

having several hard shots that were just wide or blocked. But the final score did not reflect the advantage in play, as the game ended at 2-1 for the opposition.

The Johnson scoring play came late in the third period. Stephen Yurichuk gained control of a deflected pass in the slot, and fired it into the bottom corner of the net. David Doole and Matt Lush got the assists. Goaltender Seth Homer was pulled for the extra attacker, and Georgetown buzzed around the Richmond Hill net, but could not get the equalizer.

There were many good plays in this close-fought contest. Jim Katsilieri made several dangerous rushes. Jaimie Bottomley combined with Yurichuk on one attack. David Doole set up Yurichuk on another. And Robbie Manckton to Evan Craighead nearly clicked. Both Shannon Morris and Andrew Elinisky blocked shots.

The game officials chose one player from each team, in each game, as most valuable player. The Georgetown winners were Elinisky, Yurichuk, and Scott Wilson. Each winner became eligible to play in an all-star game on Sunday afternoon.

Next week, the team travels to Brampton to play in an exhibition match.

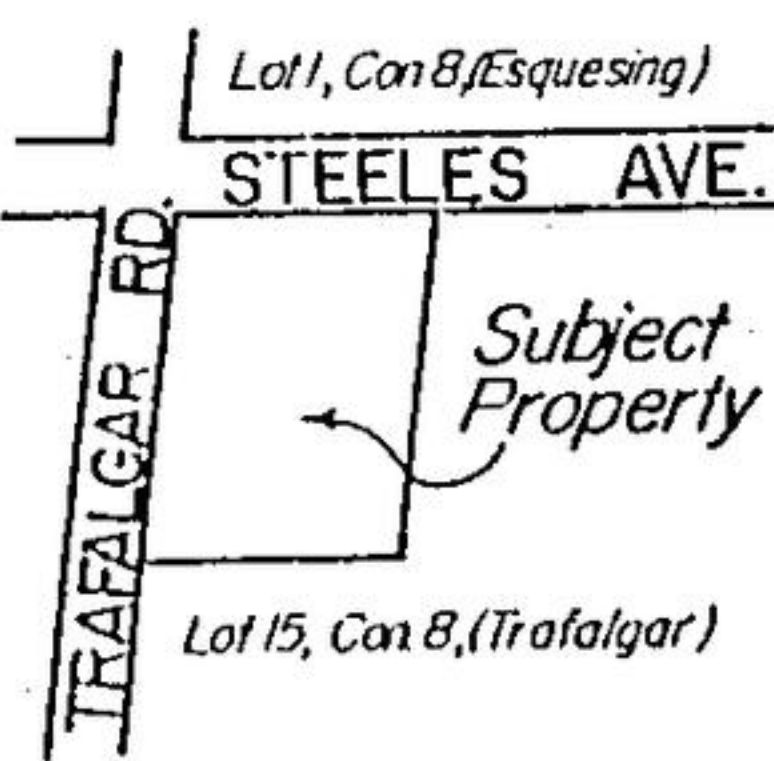

REASON FOR DESIGNATION - "CRAIGLEA":

The house was built before 1881, of clapboard in the Classical Revival style. Architectural features of note include the main door frame, gabled roof, and window arrangements. Historically, the property is associated with the Stewart family and William Lyon MacKenzie who in 1837 addressed a crowd on the property.

Any person may, within thirty (30) days of the first publication of this Notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Acting Clerk of the Town of Halton Hills, notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with the reasons for the objections and all relevant facts. If such a Notice is received, the Council for the Town of Halton Hills shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
