Promising field for Open


Defending champion Curtis Strange, Skins Game winner Lee Trevino and 1984 champion Greg Norman have indicated they will play in the 1988 Canadian Open Golf Champlonship for the du Maurier Trophy and will compete for the winner's share of the \$1 million prize purse.

The prize money increase of \$150,000 and entry of three of the PGA Tour's players (who are also former Open champions) were announced today by R.H. (Dick) Grimm, director of professional tournaments for the Royal Canadian Golf Association.

The 1988 Open, the world's fourth oldest national golf championship, will be played Aug. 29 - Sept. 4 at Glen Abbey Golf Club, permanent site of the Open, with the winner receiving \$180,000 and the du Maurier Trophy.

"The Open has always attracted an excellent field in the past and this substantial purse increase should help ensure another outstanding field," Mr. Grimm said.

In kicking off the annual pre-Christmas ticket and special package sales campaign, Mr. Grimm also said that, while only a limited number of Pro-Am spots are available, the 600 Executive Ticket Packages and other advance ticket packages, such as Weekly Badges and Anyday Vouchers, are now available by calling 416-844-1800.



"By purchasing tickets early, golf fans can assure themselves of substantial discounts. Tickets make great Christmas gifts," he said.

The RCGA also announced two personnel changes. Fred W. Oliver becomes Chairman of the Organizing Committee replacing Keith Gray, and Paul White joins Glen Abbey as course superintendent, replacing Don McFaul.

Mr. Oliver, a member of the RCGA Board of Governors since 1985, served as chairman of the Security Committee for 10 years and was deputy chairman of the Canadian Open the last two years. Mr. White was formerly course superintendent at Lambton Golf Club in Toronto.

A Brantford native, Mr. Oliver has lived in Oakville the past 39 years and was the Town's Chief of Police for 25 years before retiring in 1980.

The same year, he was elected to the Regional and Town Councils and is still a councillor.

"We are fortunate to have Fred as Chairman," Mr. Grimm said. "He has been a committee member since the Open moved to Glen Abbey and has worked hard to make the Canadian Open one of the top PGA Tour events.

"His vast experience will be invaluable. I'm confident all the committe chairmen will enjoy working with Fred and deputy chalrman Ed Barnes and we're looking forward to an outstanding championship next year."

Mr. Oliver founded the Trafalgar-Oakville Water Alr Rescue Force; has served on the Board of Governors at Sheridan College for six years and is a member and past president of the Oakville Golf Club. He has one son and three daughters and eight grandchildren.

- whole graham wafers
- *1 cup brown sugar 15 cup butter or margarine
- · 12 CUD milk •1 1/2 cups graham wafer crumbs
- •1 cup chopped walnuts
- *1 cup shredded coconut
- " 14 cup maraschino cherries, cut and drained well.

Line 9 x 9" pan with whole graham waters. Trim to fit, Set aside, in saucepan, combine sugar, butter and milk. Bring to boll. Let simmer for 2 minutes. Remove. Add wafer crumbs, nuts, coconut and cherries, stirring to mix. Pour over waters in pan. Cool. Frost and let stand overnight.

ICING

- •1½ cups loing sugar 3 thep butter or margarine
- •1 thap plus 2 tap milk
- . 1/2 tap vanilla

Beat all together in small bowl, ice bers and allow to stand for several hours. Cut into 36 squares.



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
