Upon signing the Contract, the student agrees to respect the Common Area, refrain from using loud or foul language in respect to the surrounding classrooms, smoke only in the designated area, refrain from horseplay or playing sports, identify himself if asked by a staff or committee member and assist other students and staff in the enforcement of these regulations.

The registration form also reminds students of the serious health hazards related to smoking. To students wishing to try to quit smoking, GDHS will refund 50 per cent of any fee they may incur when entering a controlled smoking clinic.

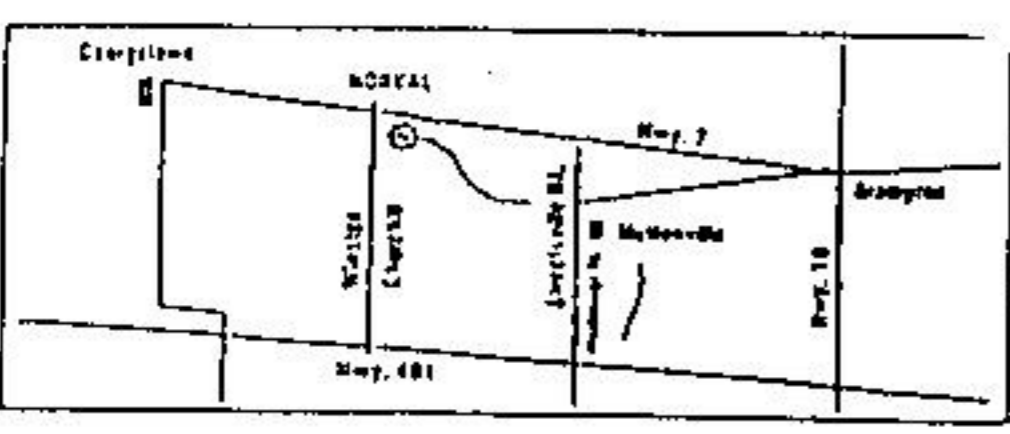
