Unfortunately due to tournament rule complications, Georgetown was not allowed to advance to the finals.

The rule stated that only the top team from each division could advance. Georgetown's second-best record did not qualify them because they did not win their division even though their record was better than the other division winner.

The team that won Georgetown's division was Ajax, whom the locals lost to 6-5.

With Ajax taking an early 1-0 lead, Georgetown tied it up in the middle of the first period with Chris Marling scoring his first of two goals with assists going to Steve Turner and Rob Cooper.

With help from Cooper's unassisted goal, the Juvies took the lead going into the second period. Georgetown led 2-1 going into the second period when Cooper scored from Jim Bick. The third period set the stage for Dixon who completed his hat-trick scoring two goals from Kennedy, Morgan, and Herman.

Georgetown won its third game of the tournament against Richmond Hill by a score of 3-1. Bill Herman set up a pass that gave Tim Bennett and Chris Marling a two-on-one. Marling blasted a shot from the top of the face off circle to give Georgetown a 1-0 lead.

Brian Doherty scored the second goal from Kennedy and Dixon and then later scored his second from Brian Peacock and Bennett. Richmond Hill scored a late goal to ruin John Lantz's bid for a shutout.

The team's ability showed the fans, and more importantly, the tournament officials, that Georgetown deserves to be in the finals after the fact. After further investigation, the Juvies were permitted to advance to the second round of the Silver Stick in Mooretown this weekend.

As far as the standings go, the Georgetown Juveniles are in second place behind a strong Burlington AAA team. With time running out, the Juvies will likely finish first, as far as AA teams are concerned and play Streetsville in the playoffs.
