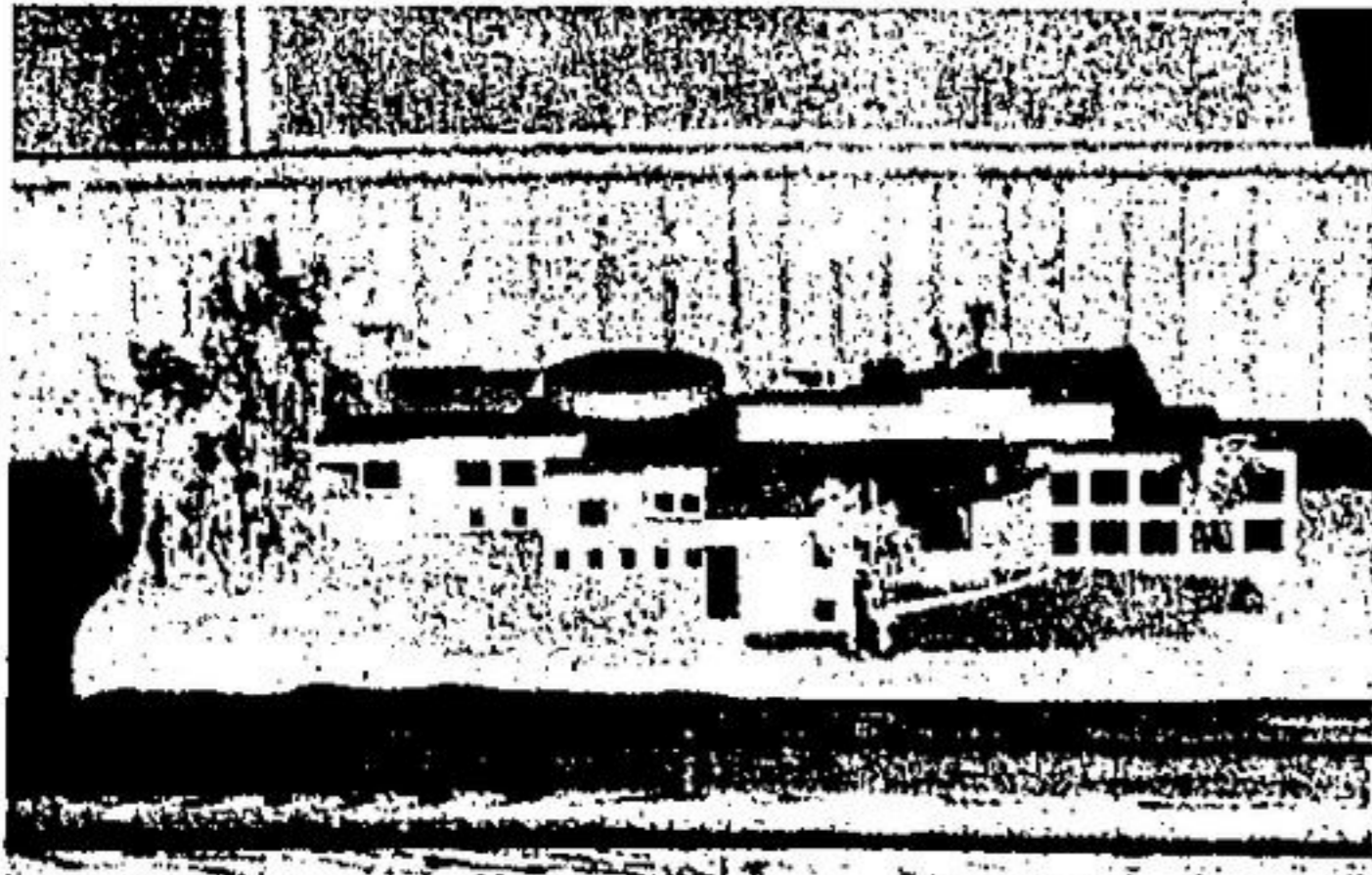


### Our new civic centre

### Vehicle fires need dousing

The fire department were called to numerous vehicle fires and a collection of other calls last week. Three fire trucks and 17 firefighters rushed to Tyler Transport at 379 Queen St. E. in Acton Jan. 14 at 9:05 p.m. to put out a burning propane bus. The department had no difficulty quenching the fire. Damage to the bus, which was unoccupied at the time, was \$20,000. The cause of the fire is undetermined. Jan. 15 at 4:52 p.m. three fire trucks and 13 firefighters attended a car fire on Winston Churchill Boulevard between the Fifth and 10th Sideroads. Damage to the vehicle was \$2,000 and there were no injuries. A report of hydro lines being down and sparking drew the fire department to Maple Avenue and Trafalgar Road Jan. 17 at 6:33 p.m. When firefighters arrived at the site Lydro workers were already on the scene. The fire department investigated a false alarm at 247 Armstrong Ave. in Georgetown Jan. 17 at 10:10 p.m.

## Environmentalists recognized by group

A number of individuals and groups in Halton Hills and area care very much about their environment. The Ralph Sherwood conservation award is up for nominations. There have been two groups from Halton Hills in the past who have won the award: the Acton High School Grade 12 environmental class and the Jaycees and Jayettes of Halton. Nominated in 1986 was Ulrich Waterman of Georgetown who has initiated a bird control program at Pearson International through the use of falcons. A Halton outdoor education teacher and a strong supporter of using Scotsdale Farm for teaching conservation, Herb Piles, was also nominated. He is a Campbellville resident who teaches in Milton. The other 1986 nominees were David Brewer of Pushtich, Grant Hutchings of Campbellville, John McKillop of Burlington, Tom Martin of Milton, John Horner of Milton and the Mississauga Clean City Campaign. Applications for nomination for 1987 must be sent to the Community Relations Division of the Halton Region Conservation Authority, P.O. Box 1097, Station B, Burlington, Ontario, L7P 3S9. Call 336-1158 for more information. Applications must be submitted by the end of January for achievement carried out the preceding year. The award is presented annually to a citizen or group who has demonstrated significant achievement in the area of environmental conservation. Mr. Waterman of Georgetown was nominated in 1986 for his efforts in promoting awareness, appreciation and importance of birds of prey. He has conducted falconry demonstrations at Mountsberg Conservation Area as part of an education program.
