Royals beat Tavistock for first road win of the season

The Hillsburgh Royals captured their first road victory of the season last week in Ontario Hockey Association Central Senior 'B' play, and did not stop there, collecting a tie on the road as well.

The Royals, who were winless this season on the road, travelled to Tavistock last Monday and dumped the home side 10-4. Then Friday, in Harrison they tied the hometown Blues 3-3.

In Tavistock, the Royals jumped into a quick 3-0 lead as Doug Pemberton converted Brian Demone's pass after just 52 seconds of play to give Hillsburgh a 1-0 lead.

Just three minutes later George Osborne scored Hillsburgh's first of three powerplay markers and then at 7:35 of the first period Kelly Sine blasted a long shot past Tavistock netminder Larry McKay.

Peter Hyde took over in the cage for McKay at this point but fared only slightly better as Demone found

the net before the first period concluded.

Hillsburgh scored six second period tallies, including two while short handed, off the sticks of Lance Doucette with a pair, Glenn Murray, John Barnes, Doug MacLean, and Sine with his second of the night.

Tavistock responded with three goals in the second and one in the third frame, led by Joe Scherer's two goals and one assist. Barnes who had a strong game for Hillsburgh collected six assists.

Royals' Brad Miller turned aside 34 shots in the Hillsburgh net while McKay and Hyde faced 33 shots for Tavistock.

Friday, Hillsburgh came from behind to salvage the three-all tie, trailing 3-1 with eight minutes remaining in the game Glenn Murray scored on the power play to narrow the margin to 3-2. Murray then set up Herb Kewley alone in front of the Harrison goal with only 1:27 left on the clock and Kewley beat Blues goalie Steve Leith to tie the score.

Brad Miller was spectacular in the Royals' net turning aside 38 of 41 shots fired his way, including a pair of breakaways to hold Hillsburgh in the game. The Royals managed 28 shots on Leith.

Hillsburgh trailed 1-0 after the first period as Jeff Bender of Harrison scored, but tied the game on the power play after 15 seconds into the second period as John Barnes' shot eluded Leith. Harrison then recaptured the lead on two quick

goals before the second period was six minutes old by Kevin Koolings and John O'Connor.

The Royals now have a record of seven wins, ten losses and one tie for 15 points and are tied with Elora for fourth spot in the seven team loop.

Hillsburgh hosts the undefeated first-place, Exeter Mohawks this Friday at 8:30 p.m.
