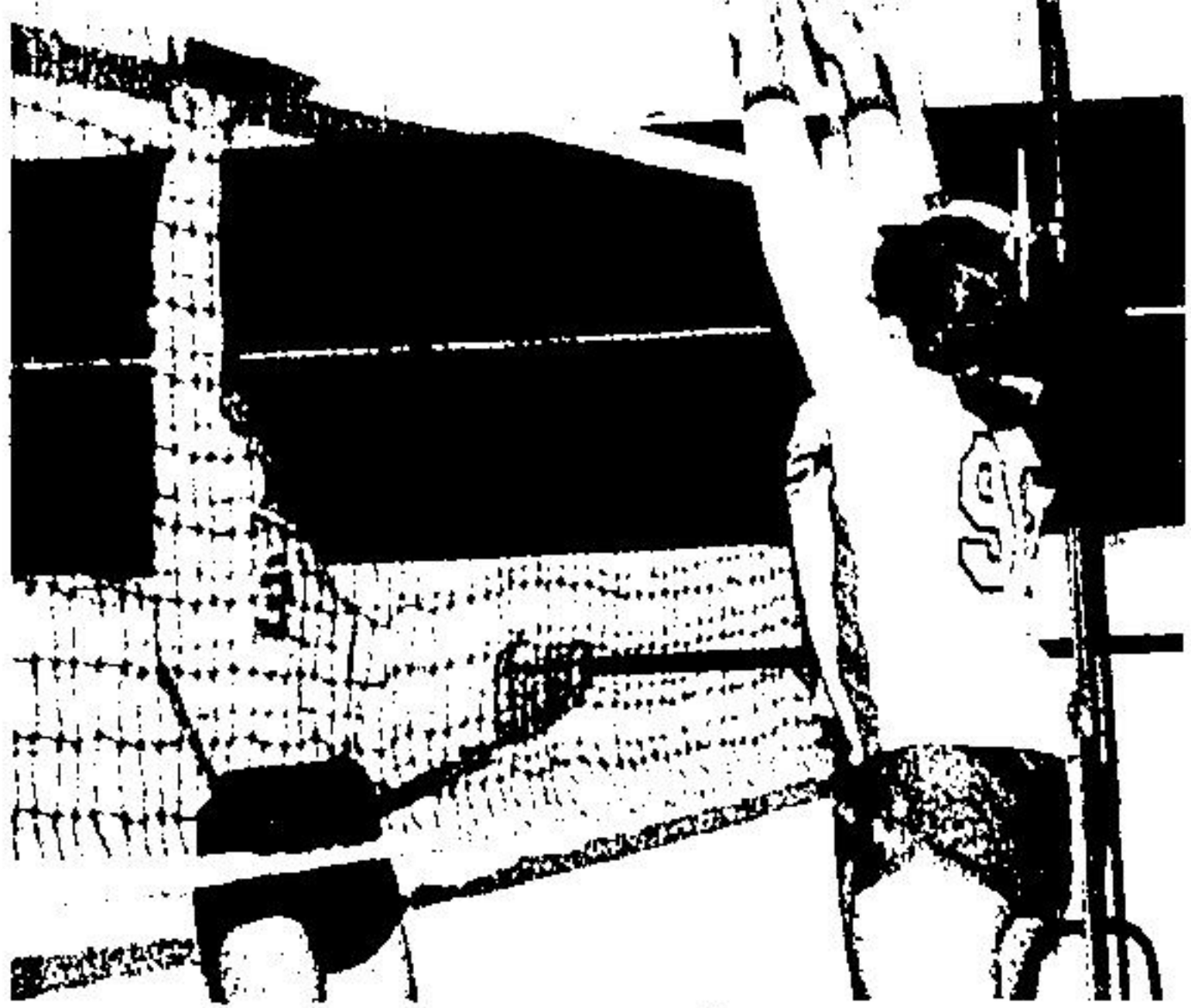

Bishop Reding in first place in jr. volleyball

Bishop Reding has taken over sole possession of first place in the East Division of the Halton junior girls' volleyball league.

Monday, the Royals took a best-of-three match from Acton High School, with scores of 15-1, 13-15, and 15-4.

Their record is now six match wins, without a defeat.

In fact, the Royals have only lost two games in their six matches the entire season, the other to Loyola.

Bishop Reding wins have been over Loyola (15-6, 9-15, 15-4); Oakville-Trafalgar (15-7, 15-7); Perdue (15-2, 15-2); Queen Elizabeth Park (15-3, 15-7); White Oaks (15-11, 15-11); and the one Monday over Acton.

The Royals' closest competition in the standings is coming from White Oaks, who have a record of five wins and one loss.

Bishop Reding rounds out their regular schedule following the break for exams, when they play Blakelock on Tuesday, Feb. 9, and then go against Georgetown on Thursday, Feb. 11.

Playoffs will begin the following week.

In the Halton East Senior division, Georgetown and Acton are fighting it out for top spot. Both have records of five straight match wins without a loss, and have yet to meet each other.

Georgetown has yet to meet Loyola, as well, and Acton must face Oakville-Trafalgar.

Royals take tourney title

The Bishop Reding Secondary School Royals downed the host Georgetown District High School Rebels in straight games, to take top honors at the Georgetown Invitational Junior Girls' Volleyball Tournament last Saturday.

The Royals won 15-13, 15-4 in the best-of-three finale, to take the championship.

A total of six teams took part in the tournament, including Lester B. Pearson, Erin, Acton, and Bramalea, as well as the two finalists.

In preliminary action, the teams played against each other in two games, with a point being awarded for each win. The Royals won nine of their 10 games, losing only to Pear-

son, which put them in the semifinals, where they defeated Acton to advance to the championship.

Bishop Reding coach Marg Dorio attributes her team's success at the tournament to their excellent team play.

"They really pulled together in their games," she says. "Each player has her own special talents, and they have a sense of each other on the court. That's their strong point. They communicate and talk to each other on the court."

Dorio was especially pleased with the play of Michelle Durante, Nicole Remedios, and setter Marlon Longo.

The Royals will resume regular schedule play in the Halton East league in February, following the break for exams.
