

### Royals take tourney title

The Bishop Reding Secondary School Royals downed the host Georgetown District High School Rebels in straight games, to take top honors at the Georgetown Invitational Junior Girls' Volleyball Tournament last Saturday.

The Royals won 15-13, 15-4 in the best-of-three finale, to take the championship.

A total of six teams took part in the tournament, including Lester B. Pearson, Erin, Acton, and Bramalea, as well as the two finalists.

In preliminary action, the teams played against each other in two games, with a point being awarded for each win. The Royals won nine of their 10 games, losing only to Pearson, which put them in the semifinals, where they defeated Acton to advance to the championship.

Bishop Reding coach Marg Dorlo attributes her team's success at the tournament to their excellent team

"They really pulled together in their games," she says, "Each player has her own special talents, and they have a sense of each other on the court. That's their strong point. They communicate and talk to each other on the court."

Dorio was especially pleased with the play of Michelle Durante, Nicole Remedios, and setter Marion Longo.
