

# Town plows over red tape to help seniors, clear snow

Town council has plowed through the bureaucratic alash to keep more sidewalks clear of snow.

Seniors and handicapped citizens in Halton Hills may soon have their sidewalks cleared for them and four other areas in town will have their sidewalks cleared.

After finding out Toronto and Etobicoke have bylaws to make sure sidewalks are cleared for the handicapped and seniors, the Halton Hills Sidewalk Snow Clearing Committee decided it's time to provide the service in town.

There is no such bylaw in Halton Hills.

Open Door Drop-In Centre Coordinator Bev Scruton has students

who are willing to provide the service, said Committee Chairman Pam Sheldon.

The town has agreed to pick up the tab for advertising the program twice in the local newspapers if the program gets off the ground.

Acton's Social Services Information Centre is already providing a service for seniors by matching them with students who would like to shovel their snow.

Council also cleared up matters of snow plowing in various parts of town Jan. 25.

About 1.1 kilometres of sidewalk on the south side of Highway 7 between Sinclair Avenue and Delrex Boulevard will be cleared.

The town pays \$700 for each kilometre of sidewalk cleared.

Two areas in Acton will also have their sidewalks cleared at the town's expense.

The east side of Main Street, south of Church Street for a distance of one block will be cleared and so will Willow Street south of Mill Street to Church Street.

The town's Engineering department is also going to clear a pile of snow left at the corner of Prince and Main Streets in Glen Williams.

The snow is left by the contractor clearing a parking lot from a local business and if the contractor doesn't remove the pile the town will.
