Local Blue Fins making a splash in swim events

A couple of members of the local Blue Fins Swim Team have been making waves in the pool with their impressive achievements. Glen Oomen and Matthew Zuraw were both presented with certificates recently to acknowledge their provincial-level times in the 50-metre freestyle.

Zuraw also received a certificate for the 100m breaststroke, after competing at the Etobicoke Invitational Swim Meet held in January. Oomen won a bronze medal, as well, in the 100 m backstroke, and Zuraw took the gold in the 100m breaststroke and a bronze in the 50m freestyle.

Zuraw added to his achievements when he was presented with the individual high points award for the 11 and 12-year-old boys category, at the Central Region "B" Championships held at the end of January.

There, Zuraw won the gold medal for the 50m freestyle, and three silver medals for the 100m individual medley, and the 100m and 200m breaststroke events.

At this meet, Zuraw broke his own previous club records in all four events.
