## Lose to host team in final

# Johnson squad second at Port Perry

Last Saturday, the Johnson and Associates Major B Atoms tuned up for the coming Harrison Division Tricounty playoffs by participating in the Port Perry Atom Tournament.

The team acquitted itself quite well, winning its first two games, to gain a berth in the final, before losing to the host Port Perry B team.

Rice Lake Bewdley provided their first round opponent. For a change, the locals were the bigger and faster team. They got on the board after only 33 seconds, when Jim Katsilieris fed Scott Wilson, who circled behind the net, and passed out to David Doole, who one-timed it into the net. Although Craig Blair and Wilson both had a pair of very good scoring chances, it remained 1-0 after first period.

Georgetown relaxed in the second period, and it cost them. Bewdley fired 10 shots at goaltender Seth Homer, scoring once to even the score. But with only 2:25 remaining, Katsilieris and Blair broke in on a two-on-one. After a perfect pass, Blair wrestled a shot off the goalie's pad, into the corner of the net.

This seemed to wake up all the locals, as the third period was all theirs. At 8:34, Blair scored an unassisted goal on a good solo rush. Bewdley narrowed the difference to 3-2 on a screen shot at 5:34, but the locals got that one back 2 minutes

later when Stephen Yurichuk sent Blair on a partial breakaway, and he tallied, to make it 4-2. This demoralized Bewdley, and Georgetown added two more goals, Jamie Bottomley from Blair and Yurichuk, and Doole from Andrew Elineky and Wilson. The final score was 6-2.

The win put them in against the Oshawa Bruins in the second round.

Again Georgetown got on the board early, scoring a shorthanded goal less than two minutes into the game. Wilson blocked a pass at his own blue line, diked the defenceman, and shot low to the glove side.

A few minutes after a Doole to Blair combination just missed, the Bruins evened the score, knocking in a rebound past goaltender Sean Mills, who had to go down to make the initial save.

Less than a minute later, the locals regained the lead, when Doole deflected a slot pass from Blair past the Oshawa goalie. Wilson also got an assist. At 2:57 Georgetown went on the power play, when an Oshawa player took out his frustration at being closely checked with a slash. The locals capitalized, with Blair taking a pass from Doole, beating the defence, and diking the goalie. It was 3-1 after first period.

Each team scored once in the se-

cond. At 8:56, Doole deflected a shot by Matt Lush. The puck flipped up in the air, and over the goaltender's shoulder. But Oshawa got that one back three minutes later on a screen shot. The period ended with the Bruin goaltender stoning Wilson on a breakaway.

Georgetown tightened up defensively in the third. As the period wore on, Oshawa started taking chances, allowing counter-chances in return. With 1:10 left, after Yurichuk hit the goalpost on a breakaway, Wilson converted a Lush pass into a breakaway and scored. The final was 5-2.

This win put them in the championship game against Port Perry. The two teams were fairly evenly matched, with the opposition having an edge in skating ability. Penalties proved the decisive factor, as two powerplay goals propelled the host team to a 3-1 victory.

The locals had two good scoring chances in the late stages of the first period, with Blair and Katsilieris both nearly scoring on one-on-one opportunities. Then, with 1:26 to go, an interference penalty gave Port Perry their first powerplay chance. They capitalized at 0:51, when a shot from the top of the left face-off circle beat the goaltender, high on the glove side.

Only 23 seconds into the second, Port Perry scored again, when a

long shot from the blue line eluded the goalie. It was 2-0. And only nine seconds after a Georgetown penalty for body contact, a blue line shot was deflected by a player in the slot into the net, to make it 3-0.

The locals got that one back at 3:21. Katsilieris made a good rush, beating two defenders to get a good shot on goal. Yurichuk was Johnny-on-the-spot to knock in the rebound. The second ended at 3-1, which turned out to be the final score.

This week, the team starts out on its quest to capture the Tricounty crown.

The same type of luck followed the Junior boys team in their attempt in Guelph. Ralph Miller, hoping his team could follow last year's team success was in top contention all day. However, Applewood, for the second time, powered its way to first place in the final game.

This local team of Scott Hobbs, Joey Robichaud, Mark Reaume, Alex Bertrand and Thain Stansfield displayed great promise for the future.
