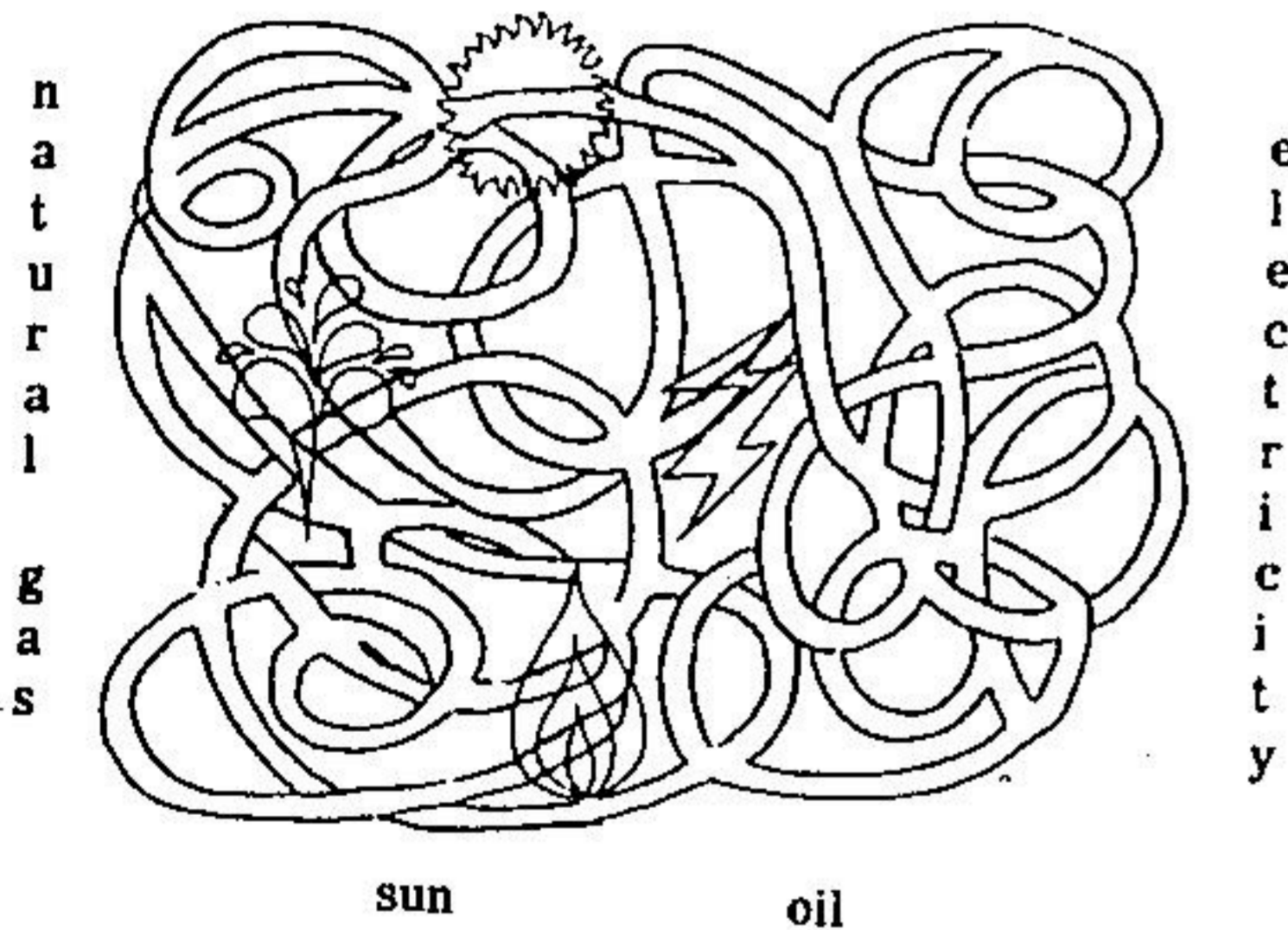

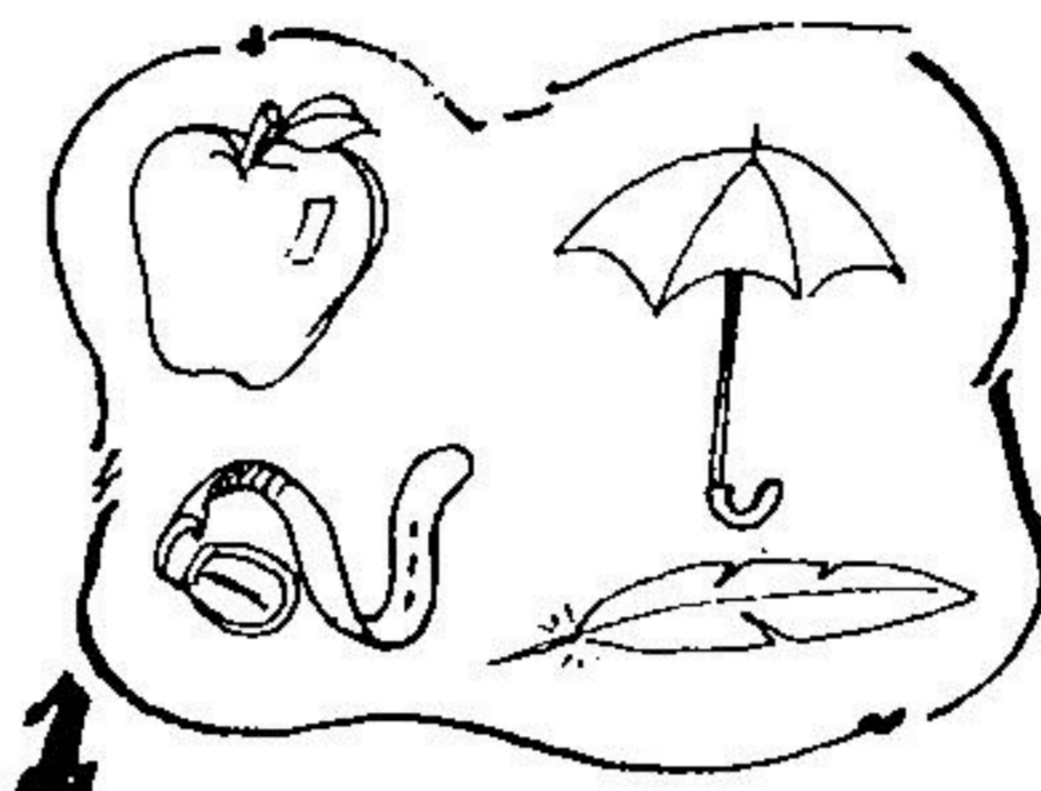

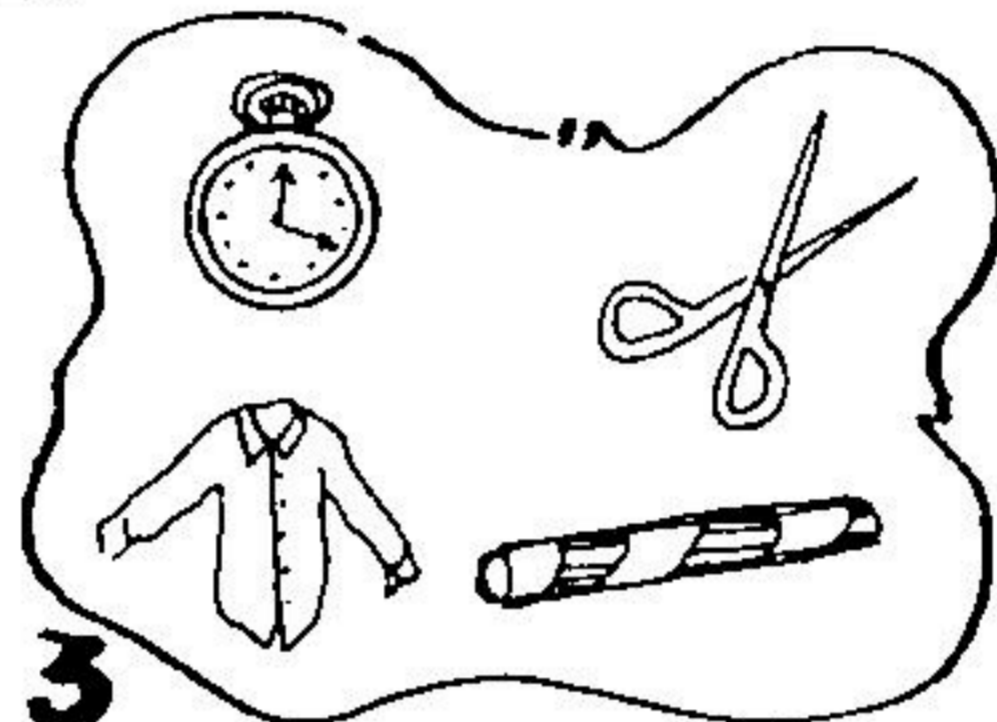
Plants are important to all living things. Trees, grass and shrubs help to make oxygen for you to breathe. Circle the one item in each group of pictures that is produced by plants.



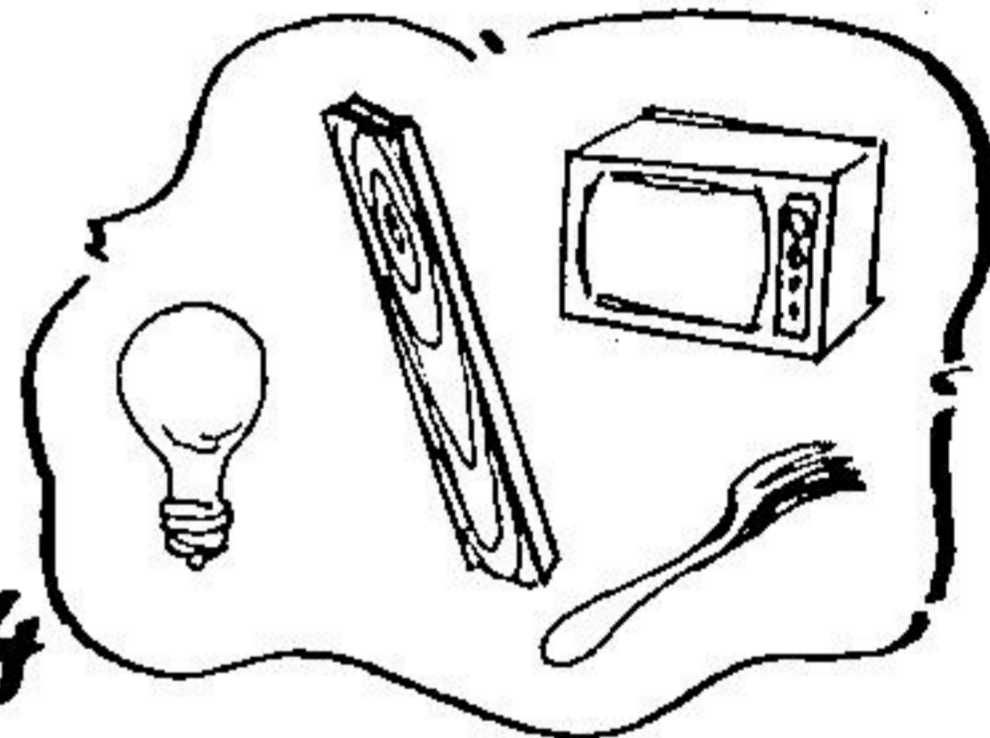

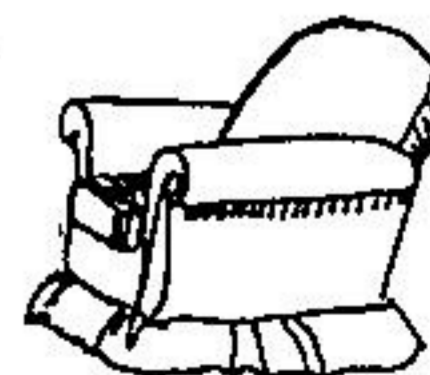
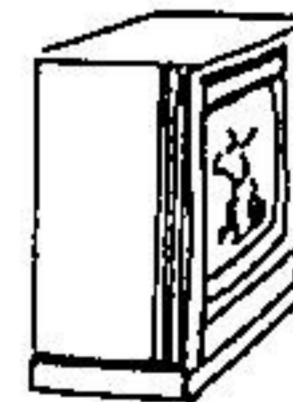
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SUPER SAVER
