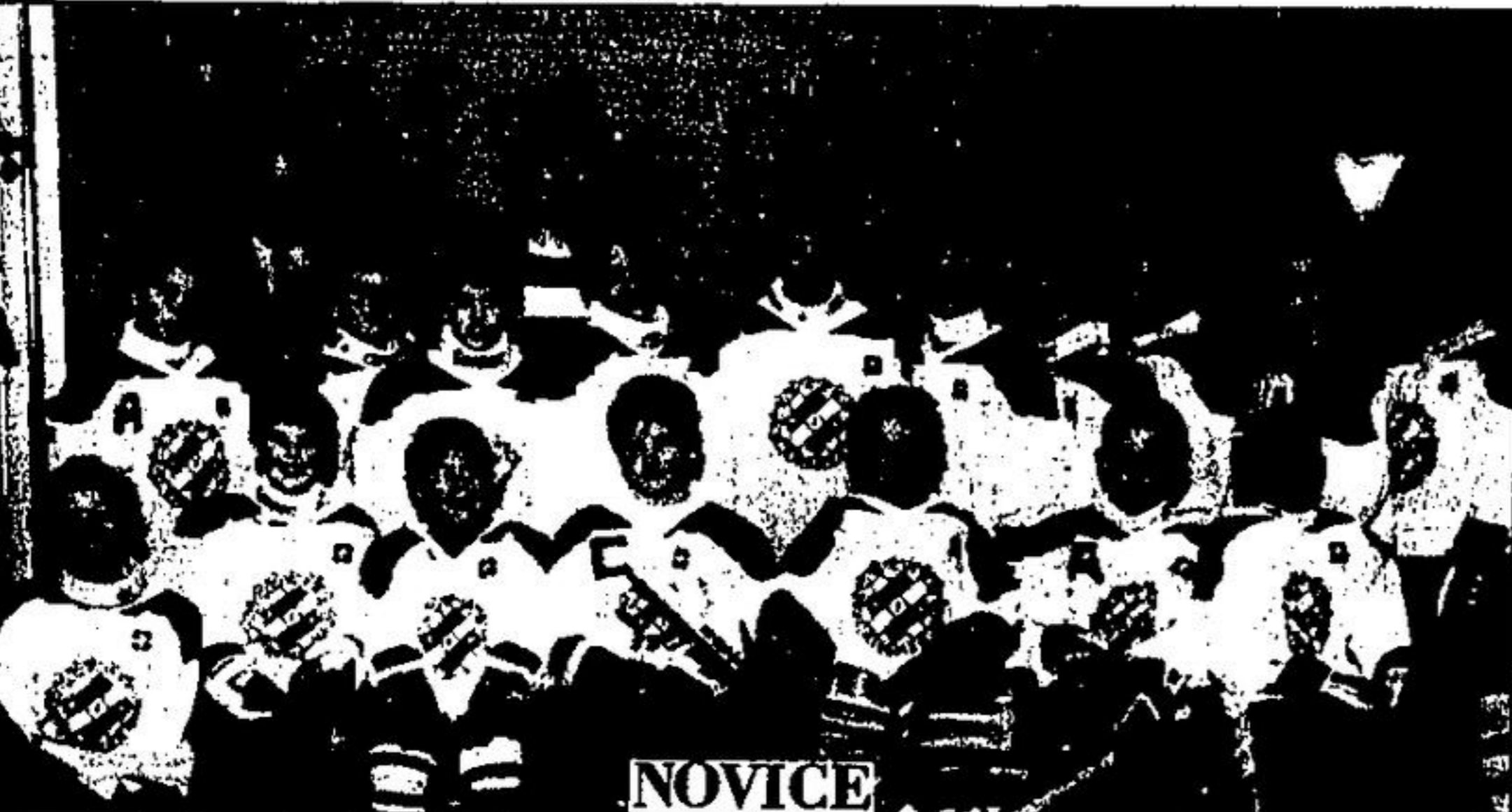
The second period produced a pair of goals by each side as McEwen and Poole tallied for Dave's and Chris Hodgins and Dean Soucie countered for McEachern.
