Vibrations bother resident after condo garage built

A parking garage behind a newly constructed condominium on Mountainview Road North has caused heavy vibrations reflected from the CNR tracks to houses in the area.

The 22-unit condominium is almost complete and is expected to have full occupancy by the end of the month.

But the CNR tracks run right behind the property to the north of the lands. As a part of the site plan requirements, the developers, Mountainview Enterprises Inc. were told to build the parking garage between the condominium and the tracks which sit below the level of the condominium.

Now Myles Lawlor, who lives directly behind of the condominium across a field, is complaining that vibrations from the CNR tracks have increased up to 50 per cent rattling windows and "that never happened before."

Mr. Lawlor said the noise problem was created when the wooden top to the parking garage was built. He suspects it's acting like a sounding

He wants the town to join in a search for a solution to the noise.

Mr. Lawlor said the developers could either demolish the parking garage, put an accoustical fence around the tracks or shore up the wooden part of the structure which seems to be causing the problems.

Mr. Lawlor acknowledged that completely eliminating vibrations would be impossible but he wants to find a way to reduce it.

But engineer John Coulter, said he could not find any way in which that amount of noise could be created by the structure.

Mr. Coulter said increased sound vibrations often creates the "psychological... impression of sound being louder than it actually

But he said the parking garage "is not a source that would give the magnitude of change that Mr. Lawlor has indicated."

The town is expected to submit a report on the noises in a few weeks.
