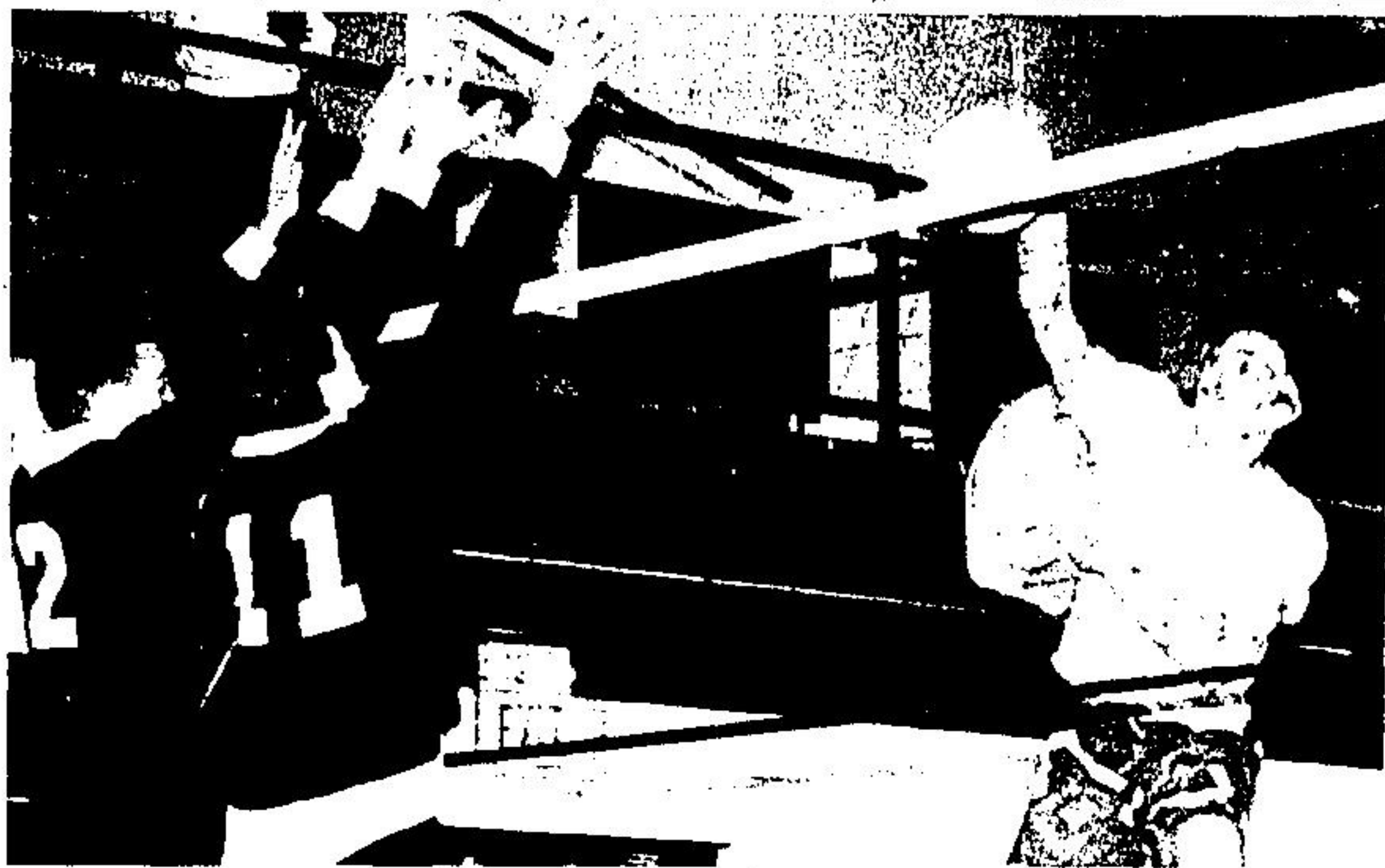


# Sports Outlook

## Leisure Lines

An early spring would be welcomed by all who enjoy the many park sites, open spaces, and school campuses available within Halton Hills for outdoor recreational activities. The Recreation and Parks Department's park and cemetery maintenance staff have prepared Town Parks for their official general opening date which was Monday, April 18. All park equipment such as play equipment components, picnic tables, garbage receptacles and signs which were removed last autumn for winter maintenance are in place, fully restored, and ready for another season of use.

Following the parks official opening date, the Department's staff resources are focused on three areas:

1. The performance of pre-season maintenance on ball diamonds and soccer/football fields in advance of their respective opening dates of May 4 and May 19.
2. The performance of spring maintenance works within municipal cemeteries.
3. The commencement of regular grass cutting and general grounds maintenance works schedules for all parks, cemeteries and Halton Board of Education school sites.

This is truly a challenging work program for Department maintenance staff, hence all efforts by park users to control litter and discourage vandalism would be greatly appreciated by everyone.

Regulations for parks use are contained within Municipal Bylaw

82-103; the following summaries from this bylaw address common problems areas:

- Parks are open from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. daily.
- Motorized vehicles of all kinds must remain on designed roadways and parking areas and observe a maximum speed limit of 10 k.p.h.
- Pets must be kept on a leash and pet excrement shall be removed by the pet owner.
- Golfing and driving golf balls is prohibited.
- The unlicensed possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited.

The clinics are free but participants are asked to register by phoning the Recreation and Parks

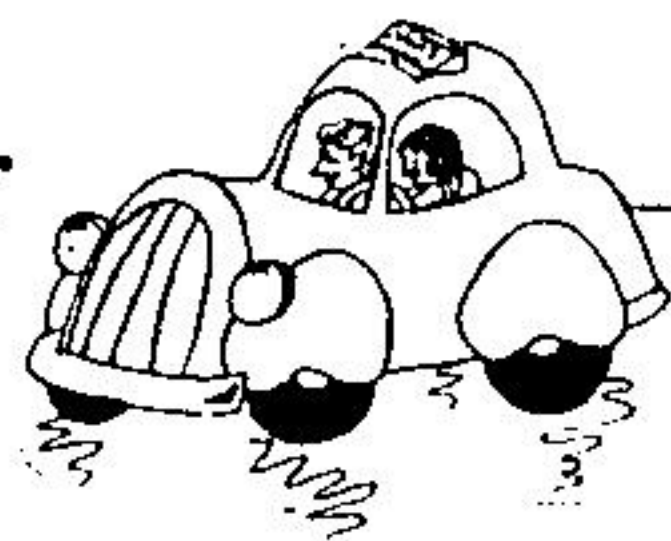
