Howden set for action

Longtime local racing enthusiast Wayne Howden will take his specially-prepared 1988 Buick Regal on its maiden voyage on Saturday, April 30, when he competes in a 40-lap, FAST-sanctioned race in Sandusky, Ohio.

Mr. Howden, the 42-year-old President of Edgar Howden and Sons Ltd., a local construction firm, will drive the most technically advanced automobile this community and, indeed, Halton Region has ever seen in his bid to overtake his American counterparts in short track, NASCAR-type stock car competition.

In deciding to compete at this level, Mr. Howden has put his excellent reputation as a racing driver and about \$150,000 of his own money on the line. And, it's all to fulfill a life-long dream - that of racing against the best NASCAR-type drivers in the United States.

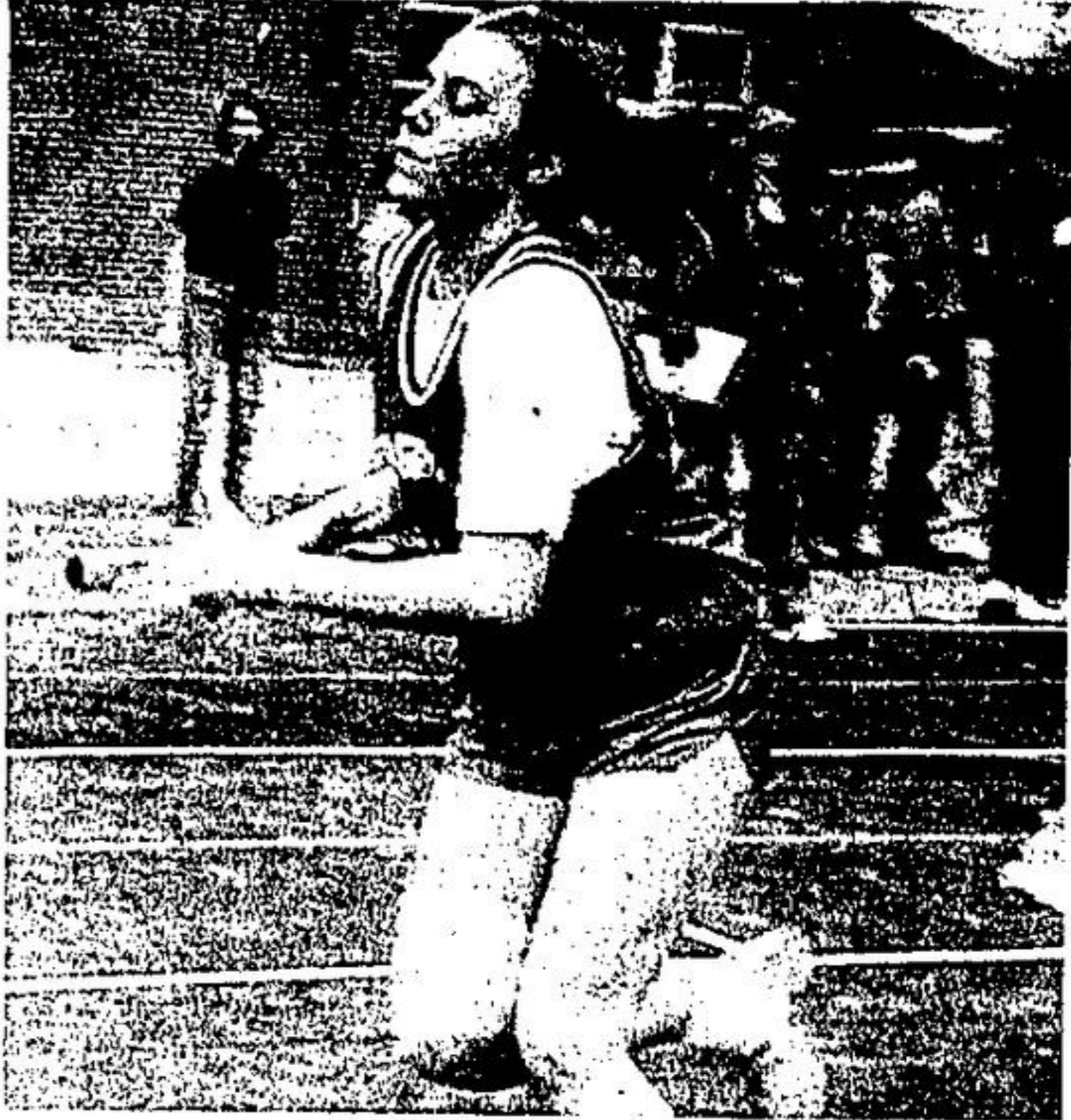
Mr. Howden is no stranger to competitive racing, having successfully competed at short tracks across the province of Ontario and the state of New York for more than 15 years. He was rookie-of-the-year in two different divisions as well as track champion during that period of time. In one three-year stretch with the same racing team, he won 18 feature races, 42 heat races, seven special races and was track champion once.

His car, a modified white 1988 Buick Regal not unlike what one would see on a NASCAR track in the southern U.S. on any given Sunday afternoon, was assembled by prominent Canadian stock car driver-turned-builder Junior Hanley. The car features a fibreglass body shell, a special Hanley chassis and a 600-horsepower, 355-cubic-inch Baker Enterprises-prepared V8 engine. Mr. Hanley has built similar cars for top NASCAR drivers Bill Elliot and Mark Martin.

Driving his familiar number 16, Mr. Howden will compete between April and October at tracks in Ontario, Quebec, Ohio, Michigan, Wisconsin and Tennessee in races sanctioned by three different bodies - the American Speed Association (ASA), the American-Canadian Tour (ACT) and FAST. He is one of only three Ontario residents competing at this level of stock car racing.

Metro fishing week slated

Children and adults, including the disabled, can discover the pleasure of urban fishing during Metro Fishing Week, July 10-17.

The highlight of the week is Metro Fishing Day, Sunday, July 10. Fishing clinics, fly fishing demonstrations, contests, and prizes will be presented from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at four Metro locations: Grenadier Pond, Eglinton Flats Pond, Rouge River Marsh, and Toronto Island Trout Pond.

Metro Fishing Week is a joint program of the Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority, the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources, and the Metro Toronto Parks and Property Department. The objective is to promote urban fishing opportunities for children, the disabled, and adults without private transportation.

There are many fishing locations in Metro Toronto and the surrounding region that are accessible by public transportation. Sport fish that can be found at these locations include salmon, trout, pike, bullheads, bass, perch, and panfish.

The Metro Fishing Day activities are presented with the support of Abu Garcia Ltd., Woodstream Canada, Normar, Ltd., and volunteers from local fishing clubs.

All anglers from 18 to 64 years of age, except for the disabled, must have an Ontario resident angling licence. A licence can be purchased at district offices of the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources, or from many sporting goods stores.
