Kelso trout derby starts May 14

Kelso Conservation Area, Milton Ontario, will be holding its Eighth Annual Trout Fishing Derby Saturday May 14 and Sunday May 15, 1988 from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily (gates open at 6 a.m.).

Last year over 700 fishermen lined the shores of Kelso Lake, going after the over 1,700 Rainbow Trout stocked that season. This popular Derby follows the opening of trout season and gives fishermen a chance to land some hearty trout ranging in size from 8-24 inches for lots of prizes.

Registration for the Derby will be at the Kelso gatehouse the days of the Derby. Fees are \$5 per adult and \$4 per person 12 and under or 65 and over. Camping is available in the park.

\$5 per person each night for truck campers and tents. An early bird breakfast is also available at our snack bar starting at 6 a.m. Prizes for the Derby are provided by the Tackle Shoppe in Milton.

Special Note: Trout season opens April 30, 1988. Kelso Conservation Area will be stocking its lake for this day with over 1,000 trout added to our already healthy stock of fish. Kelso Park will be open from dawn until dusk for fishing. Vehicle entry fee of \$4 per car will apply. The snack bar will be open during the day.
