In Halton Hills, the Welcome Wagon's "Birth of Baby" program is a reminder of just how special the occasion can be.

Welcome Wagon hostess Debbie Butler made her first baby visit in town in the fall of 1986.

Recently Mrs. Butler was rewarded for her efforts by being nominated the "Hostess of the Year" in her population category for the Region.

Mrs. Butler has seen the Birth of Baby program which has been going since 1963 in various capacities throughout Canada grow in just two short years.

When Mrs. Butler or any Welcome Wagon hostess visits a house, she brings special gifts for the family and their new infant to enjoy.

She brings greetings from various program sponsors in town as well as gifts like a pocket secretary and sister's guide, a breakfast for two at Night Crossing Restaurant, a large pizza from Pompei Pizza, a book gift certificate from Oxford Books, a quilted baby's bib from the Betty House, a fancy lace and terry baby's bib from Little Angels, a financial planning guide and a piggy bank.

But Mrs. Butler also brings information on how to best use community services. Some of that information can be valuable when it's needed the most. Families receive information on local civic and social services and facilities like where police and fire departments are located. Other information includes a directory of services for young mothers such as day care centres, and brochures from the Red Cross and education and support services.

Mrs. Butler has three daughters of her own. Her family allows her to understand how much this means to my visit recipients, she says.

They are all so grateful and appreciative of both gifts and civic information, she added.

The Birth of Baby program now has 19 official sponsors but there is always room for more, said Mrs. Butler.

Arena sales cause for confusion

Town councillors aren't sure whether or not they voted to halt all special sales in the Memorial Arena last fall.

Mayor Russ Miller told councillors Monday that a liquidation sale is planned for the arena on Friday and Saturday. After a businessman appeared before council last fall asking for the arena sales to be stopped, council deferred the issue until Recreation Director Tom Shepard prepared a report on arena sales.

Mr. Shepard's report had not come before council and CCP Liquidators had been issued a permit by the town for a sale this weekend.

Councillor Al Cook thought the town had voted not to hold any more sales in the arena until the report came before council.

When Deputy Clerk Delmar French dug up the motion from the Sept. 2 meeting it read "the matter of retail sales is to be deferred until a report is brought back."

Some councillors were not sure if that meant no sales are to be held in the arena until council sees the report, or if it meant the decision will be put off until the report is produced.

But Coun. Peter Norton said he was sure he was voting to stop the sales at the time.

Coun. John McDonald said "It is quite clear what we wanted to do last year."

But Coun. Norm Elliott disagreed. He said the mood of council was not to halt the sales but to wait until the report came back.

Coun. Betty Fisher wants the report back for the next general committee meeting "even if somebody has to burn the midnight oil to do it."

"Somebody gave a license out and I want to find out why," said Coun. Norton.

Town Engineer Bob Austin who was acting administrator in the absence of Ray King, warned coun-

cillors not to pass a motion to stop sales now because others may already have permits.
