



After Alligator would like to learn the names of the parts of the camera labeled. Can you belp him by following the mixed-up lines to identify each camera part?






1. The first camera was called the camera obscura, which means "dark chamber," for that is exactly what it was - a large darkened box with a hole in one side through which light could enter.
