Oh Jays win twice in powderpuff play

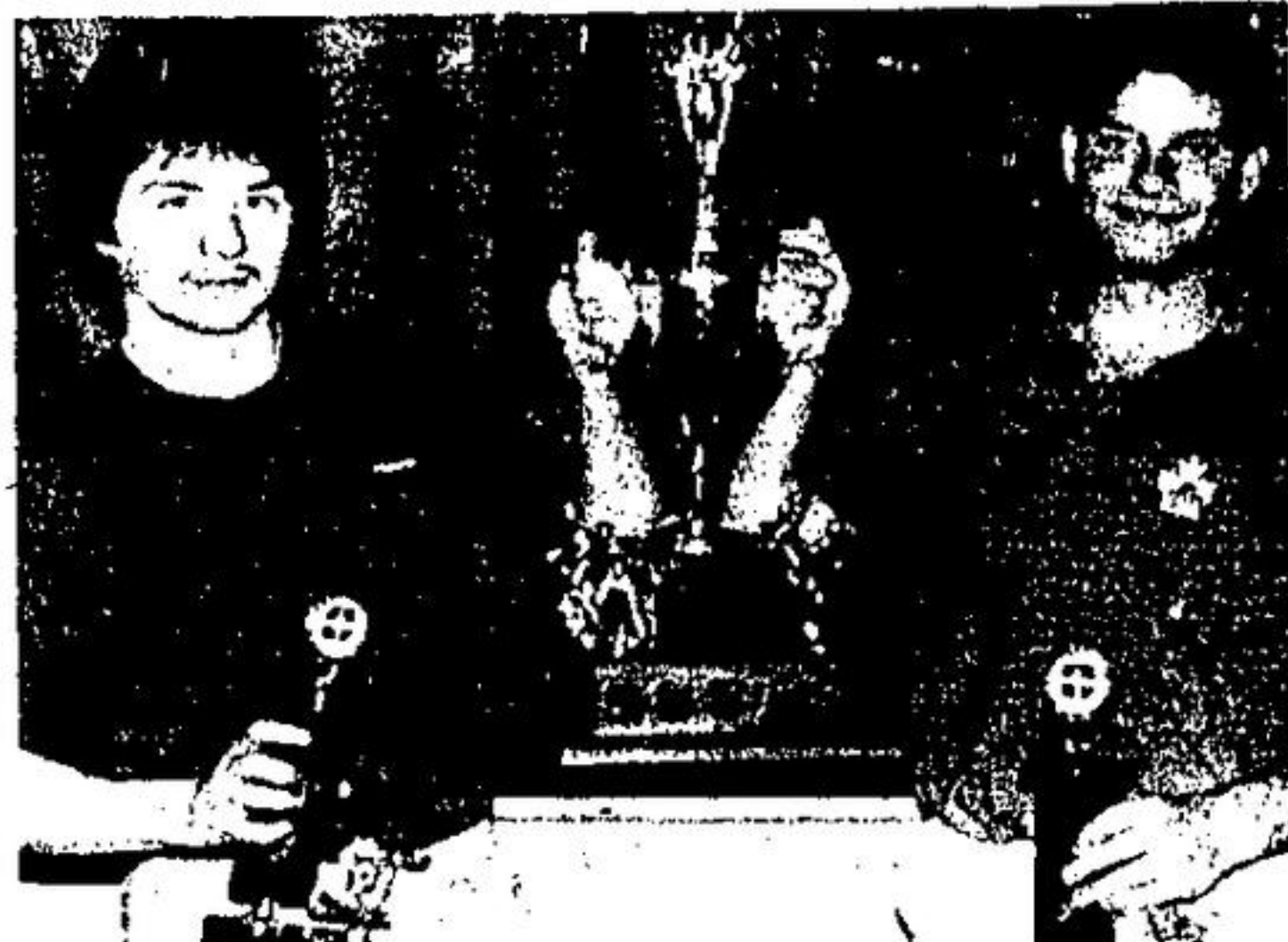
**Broozers 6

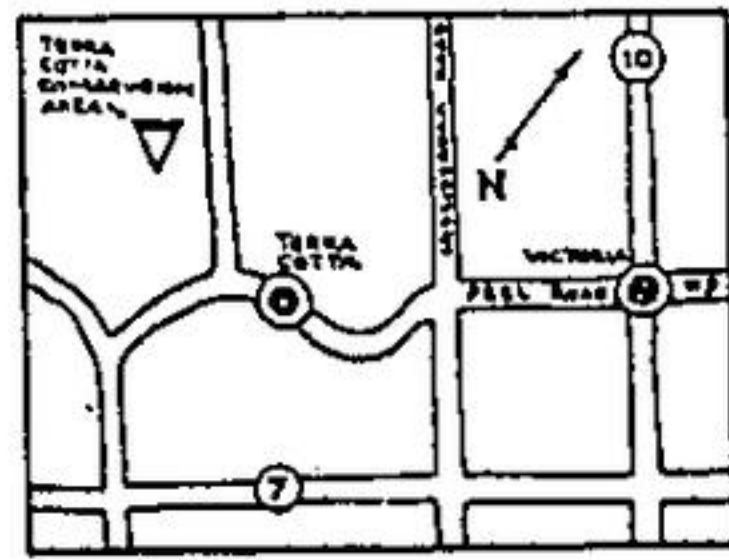

Tough week for Rebels

Last week was a rough one for the GDHS Rebels rugby squads as the locals took it on the chin for six losses.

On Thursday the Rebel seniors dropped a 15-10 decision to M.M. Robinson while the junior contingent lost by a 18-11 count. The midget side faced local rival Acton and suffered a 24-9 drubbing.

Those performances, however, were a direct improvement on the teams' outings of May 10 when the Rebels lost a tripleheader to Assumption. The senior side lost a respectable 10-4, the juniors fell 16-4 and the midgets were blanked 30-0. But Thursday's games, albeit losses, had GDHS coach Bill Bingham feeling optimistic about future rugby forays.

"We played the junior game two men short," said coach Bingham. "Despite that, our kids played well. We kind of ran out of gas, though, and didn't use the wind properly in the first half."

Meanwhile, Bingham saw great improvement in the senior side during the second half of their loss to M.M. Robinson. "It was the same kind of thing as the junior game," he stated. "We played better against

the wind. We had some better inside passing in the second half."

Bingham said the GDHS midget squad is learning each time it hits the field. "This is the first time we've run a midget team and there's a lot of inexperience," he said.

Tomorrow (Thursday, May 20) the junior Rebels will visit Drury in Milton while both the midget and senior sides travel to Burlington to face the Nelson Bulldogs.

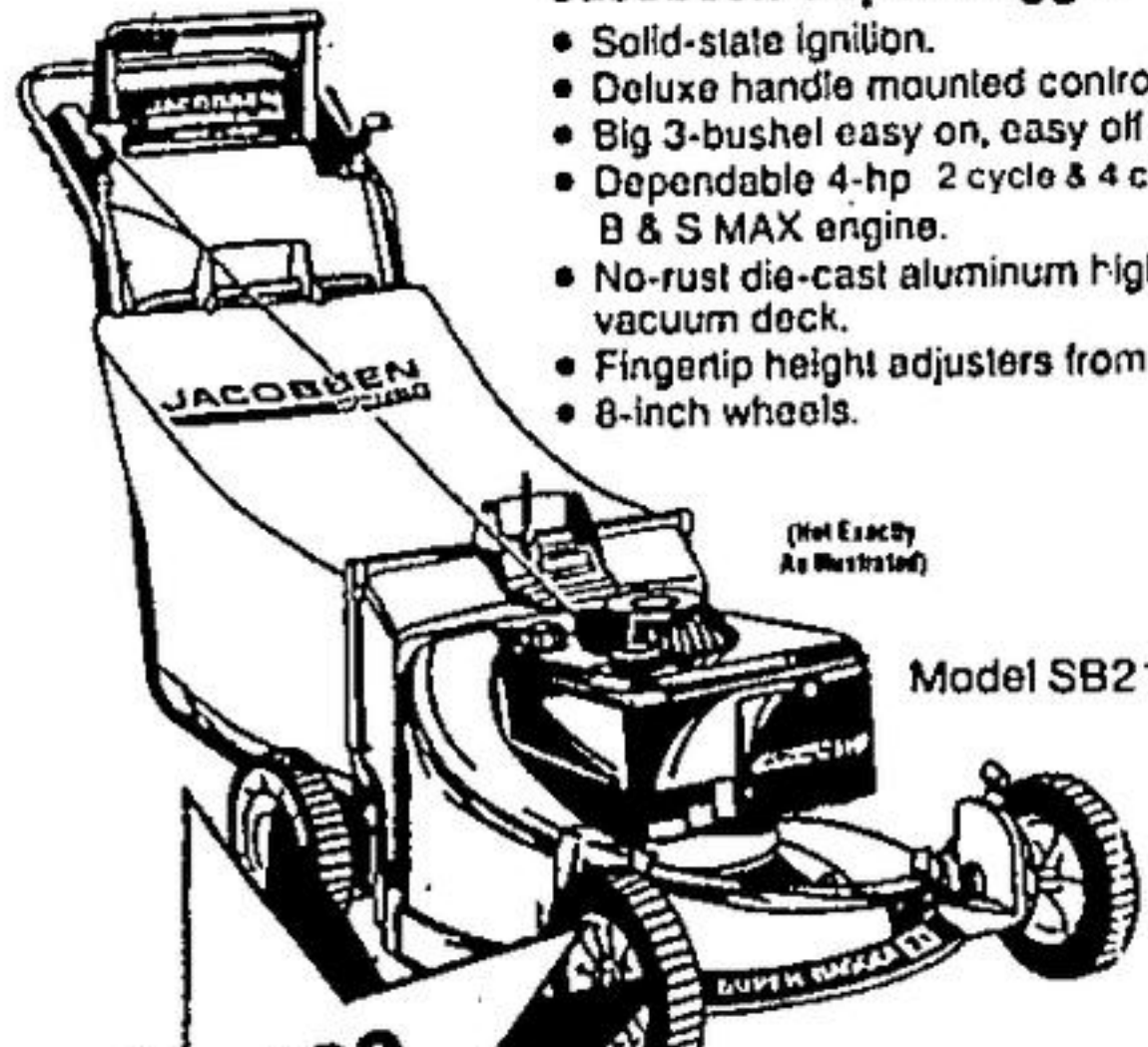
