Runnin' Rebs fast at GHACs

Eight first-place finishes highlighted a strong showing by the GDHS Rebels track and field team at the GHAC meet in Burlington on May 19 as 40 Georgetown athletes advanced to the southern Ontario-regionals in Etoblooke on May 24.

The GHAC competition featured action in 47 events and seven relays with the top five finishers in each final qualifying for the southern Ontario regionals.

Gold performances for GDHS came from Yanne Letarnec in the senior boys' 800-metre event (1:58.65); Dave Paul, senior boys' 3000-metres (8:42.50); Melanie Jans, midget girls' 80-metre hurdles (13.94); Sheri Nairn, junior girls' 3000-metres (11:06.72); Cindy Kallo, junior girls' javelin (29.05 metres); Mark Dunning, senior boys' discus (43.04 metres).

Dave Paul added a second firstplace finish as he broke the tape in the open 2000-metre steeplechase in a time of 5:59.19. Georgetown, incidentally, finished 1-2-3 in the event with Rick Lane taking second spot (6:34.05) and Sean Cleary claiming third (6:41.31).

GDHS's midget girls' 4 x 100metre relay team also hit paydirt, winning their event in 54:63.

Other strong efforts came in the midget girls' division where Natalie Goldson took second in the 80-metre hurdles (13.95), finishing just .01 second behind Melanie Jans. Holly Sones finished third in shot put, Trisha Harkley won bronze in the triple jump and Megan Lusby was third in the 3000-metre run.

Sarah Broughton also took a third, claiming a 1:05.81 in the 400-metre

In junior girls' Lisa Carter was second in the 400, Melissa Corson took silver in the shot put, Tara Burroughs had a third in the 400 and Sheri Nairn took third spot in the

Shannon Snyder finished second in the senior girls' 400 while Teri Korzack had a third in the 100.

Trent Cull placed second in midget boys' shot put with a 13.93-metre toss while Dave Lawrence was third in the 400.

Mike Dyer (100) and Glenn Mulder (400) claimed seconds each in junior boys' sprint events with Mulder adding a bronze in the 800. Bob Donker took third in the 3000.

Georgetown's senior boys' open 4 x 400 relay team finished second in the division's final heat.

Qualifiers after the southern Ontario meet will advance to the annual provincial OFSAA finals in June, also slated for Etobicoke.

Ten-year-old Angela Stiles of Glen Williams placed second in the Ontario gymnastics championships on May 14-15 in Thorold, adding more medals to an already extensive collection.

Angela's silver medal performance in the pre-Argo division
capped off what has been a very successful competitive season for the
local gymnast. Angela's father Bob
says the youngster harbors national
level aspirations and her work at the
provincials should bode well for a
move up the competitive ladder next
vear.

"Her coaches feel she has the potential to go national," said Mr. Stiles last weekend. "As the format stands now she'll probably move up to Argo "A" next year."

Only .15 points separated Angela from first-place finisher Holly Patterson of the Hamilton-Wentworth Gym Club at the provincial championships, hosted by Thorold's Sparks Gym Club. Angela, working out of Bramalea's Gymnastics Club, turned in a 36.45 point total while Patterson won the overall title with a 36.59.

"There was only one point difference between the top five girls," said Mr. Stiles. "It was a very close competition."

Angela placed in all events except one, taking silver in both the beam and floor exercises. She was fourth in vault and seventh on the bars. The pre-Argo division featured a total of 40 athletes, six from each provincial region.
