Mrs. Kentner hopes to sell 2,000 tickets, and has started knocking on Georgetown business doors to sell advance tickets.

Ice cream is being supplied by Neilson's.

When all the fun is done, Mrs. Kentner and her band of 18 volunteers, who will be manning the booth, plan to contact the Guiness Book of World Records to hopefully get recognition for their

massive sundae bar.
