Fun's under the sun is the theme for the sundae bar, which will be spread beneath a yellow and white striped marquee tent.

Participants can lay down their \$2.50 and start loading up as they walk the 60-foot line of toppings and ice cream.

"It sounds so delicious," said co-organizer Gerry Kentner.

The Georgetown resident and her partner, Jane Hoddnott, have spent the past six months organizing their portion of the BIG event, which will also include kites, balloons, wind surfers, beach balls, roller skates, pony tails, poodle skirts and the sounds of the 50s and 60s.

Mrs. Kentner hopes to sell 2,000 tickets, and has started knocking on Georgetown business doors to sell advance tickets.

Ice cream is being supplied by Neilson's.

When all the fun is done, Mrs. Kentner and her band of 18 volunteers, who will be manning the booth, plan to contact the Guinness Book of World Records to hopefully get recognition for their massive sundae bar.
