## Right-Rider cycle program gets rolling

Police chiefs in communities across Canada will be distributing a free instructional bicycle and road safety audio visual and teaching kit to elementary school classrooms across Canada by the end of May.

This is in response to concerns by police, school officials and parents with the increasing number of bicycle-related accidents which occur each year. Bicycle accidents account for hundreds of Canadian children being killed or injured each year.

The audio visual and the teaching kit are part of 'Right-Riders', a national bicycle and road safety program developed by Petro-Canada. The program is the product of a national seminar attended by Traffic Safety Officers representing every province and territory in Canada.

The 12-minute 'mini-movie' instructs children on the basic rules of the road and encourages them to use common sense when operating their bicycles. Presented in a fun and entertaining manner which makes safety rules easy to learn, the taped presentation is a reinforcement to young people that police are their friends. Each tape, containing both English and French versions, is being distributed by police forces nationwide. It will reach more than 13,000 schools across Canada, and affects an estimated four million children from Kindergarten to Grade six.

The bilingual teaching kit was designed to reinforce and extend the safety message of the video. It can be utilized on its own or as part of the on-going bicycle safety program.
