

Lost control

An Oakville man was taken to hospital following a 4:44 a.m. accident on the Fifth Sideroad and Sixth Line. Ole Nielsen, 26, was treated and released from the Milton District Hospital. A 1984 grey Mazda, driven by a 26-year-old Oakville man, was eastbound on the Fifth Sideroad going at a high rate of speed, when the vehicle went out of control on a sharp curve. The Mazda hit a steel mail box stand and hydro pole. A charge of failing to provide a breath sample was laid. The car was demolished.

Deer hit

Tops in French



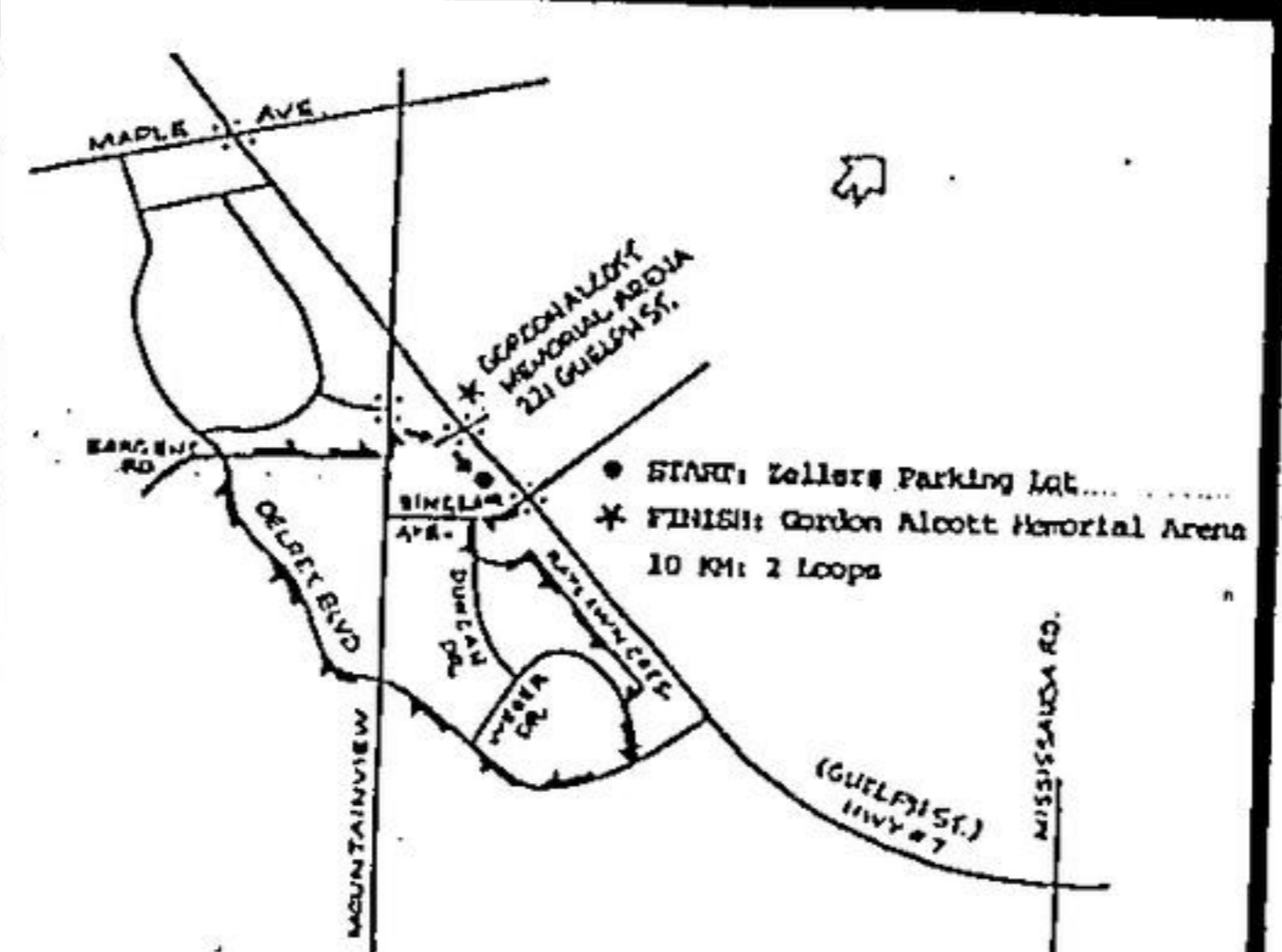

Firefighters busy

Firefighters were forced out of their beds many mornings last week to answer early hour calls, including a barn fire, false alarm and garbage bin fire.
At 2:30 a.m. June 3, 13 Acton firefighters rushed to help 15 Milton firefighters battle a barn fire at Lot 29, Concession 5 in Nassagaweya. Seven horses were killed and damage was estimated at \$175,000 during the six-hour fire, which burned the barn to the ground.
Firefighters investigated an alarm activation June 2 at 1:08 a.m. at 71 Todd Rd. The false alarm was suspected to be caused by a drop in the building's water pressure.
A garbage bin fire June 5 at 12:56 a.m. behind the King Submarine on Mountainview Road South resulted in no damage.
Firefighters investigated a report of a possible plane down on the Sixth Line. The Georgetown department responded but found nothing.
June 4 at 2:09 p.m. Acton firefighters attended to a grass fire on Highway 7 and the First Line.
Firefighters responded to an alarm activation June 4 at 6:34 p.m. at 62 Park Ave. The false alarm was in the same apartment where last week's fire occurred and the fire alarm had not been replaced.
Insulation, which started on fire in a house, brought firefighters to Lot 27, Concession Seven June 3 at 1:46 p.m. Sparks from welding started the fire in the house, which was located across from the Cedar Springs Motel. There were no injuries.
Halton Hills firefighters assisted Milton firefighters in dousing a barn fire June 5 at 2:55 a.m. on the Fifth Sideroad and Highway 25.
The barn fire rekindled at 1:06 p.m. June 5.
