Jon Voight and Eric Roberts star in this tense escape thriller set in Alaska. Voight is the hardened criminal who escapes from a maximum prison up north, with Roberts as the chatty young con who comes with him. They get on an unmanned

freight train; the engineer just had a heart attack. The train rushes wildly through the beautiful snowy scenery while Voight is being tracked by a murderous warden. Rebecca de Mornay finds herself forced to trust these two. Both actors won Oscar nominations for this movie, and this is an above average thriller that

packs a hold-your-breath ending.

THE BIG EASY Dennis Quald (I think I have a crush on him!) and Ellen Barkin star in this entertaining story of police corruption down in New Orleans. He is a slightly crooked cop and she is investigating cop corruption. The two get involved romantically and find themselves embroiled in a series of murders. 




