# Quartet finds pure harmony

Anyone who appreciates the sound of the human voice will be pleased to take in the harmony of "New Image" at this year's Pioneer Days.

The a capella quartet will entertain people at Pioneer Days on Main Street starting at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, June 16 with their captivating

brand of harmony. An a capella group means there is no accompanying instruments, said spokesperson Cathy Alger.

New Image consists of Don Hill singing base, Don Gillespie singing baritone, while Mrs. Alger sings lead and Benny MacLeod is soprano.

The group blends both male and female vocal harmony on such well known songs as New York, New York, Kiss Him Goodbye, In The Mood, and Coloring Book.

Vocal harmonies have made a comeback lately thanks to groups like the Nylons, whose version of Kiss Him Goodbye hit the charts recently, said Mrs. Alger.

And many other bands such as the Manhattan Transfer, are incorporating vocal harmony in their music, she said.

Even Art Garfunkel has taken a stab at harmony, with his popular song So In Love, she said.

New Image actually got together when they were singing "do wa" type background vocals for another band recording a demonstration tape, said Mrs. Alger.

But feedback from listeners was positive so the members started to arrange some music for themselves.

Singing harmony without instruments is more difficult than regular bands because each member is usually singing a different note and the chords have to be "totally balanced," she said.

Singing doesn't have to be as accurate when it's accompanied by instruments, she said.

"We feel it's much more gratifying."

New Image gets together once a week for about three hours to rehearse. But each member puts in a lot of individual time perfecting the songs, said Mrs. Alger.
