Lottery prizes

More than 40 lottery prizes worth a total of \$100,000 have been awarded to ticket holders across the province in the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters' Conservation Lottery.
 The prizes this year were the best ever! The grand prize was a Jeep Cherokee Laredo plus a Stryker Fish/Ski Bass Boat with a 90 h.p. Mercury Motor and E-Z Loader Trailer. Second prize was a Jeep Y.J. Laredo; third prize was a 16 foot Lund 'Pike' Fishing Boat, 40 h.p. Evinrude Motor and E-Z Loader Trailer. Other top prizes included a Yamaha Big Bear A.T.V., a week for two at Windy River camp in the Northwest Territories, a fur coat by Cahill Furs of Peterborough, a 3-day hunting trip for two to Dave's Moose and Goose Hunt in Moose Factory, and a Coleman Ram-X Gold Medalist Canoe.
 The draw was held on May 31 at the STEL-Red Oak Inn in Peterborough. Winning tickets were drawn by Mr. Mark Mandic, Advertising Director for Angler and Hunter magazine.
 The Conservation Lottery is the main fundraiser for the 60-year old Federation, Ontario's largest provincial conservation organization. The money generated by ticket sales over the past nine months will be used to fund the Federation's continuing work to keep Ontario's lakes and forests healthy, and its fish and wildlife abundant. The 72,000-member Federation is known for such programs as the reintroduction of wild turkeys to Ontario, annual Junior Conservation Schools for teenagers, Pitch-In, and their vocal acid rain abatement campaign.
