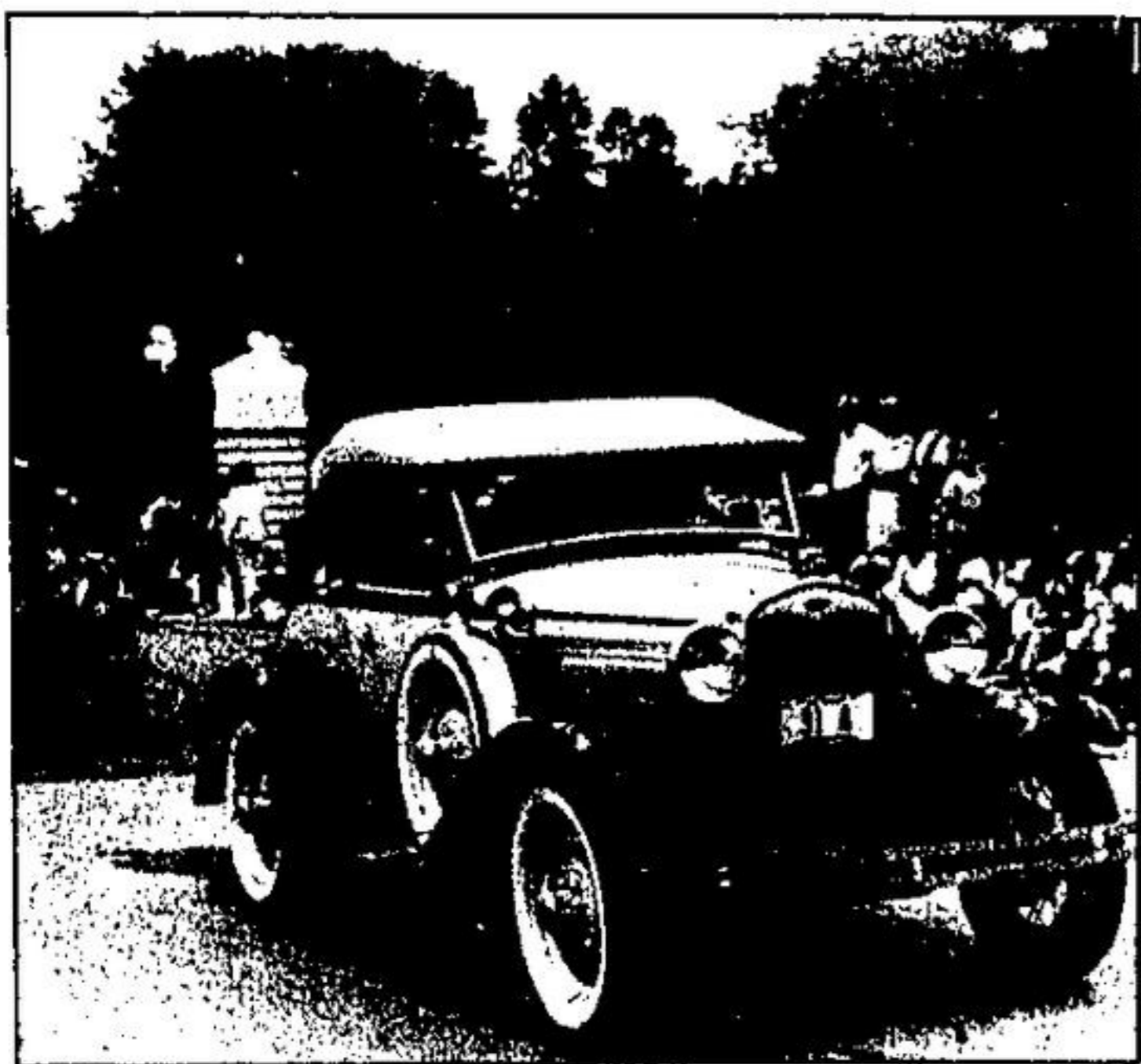


Canada turns 121

Thousands in Halton Hills celebrate Canada's birthday



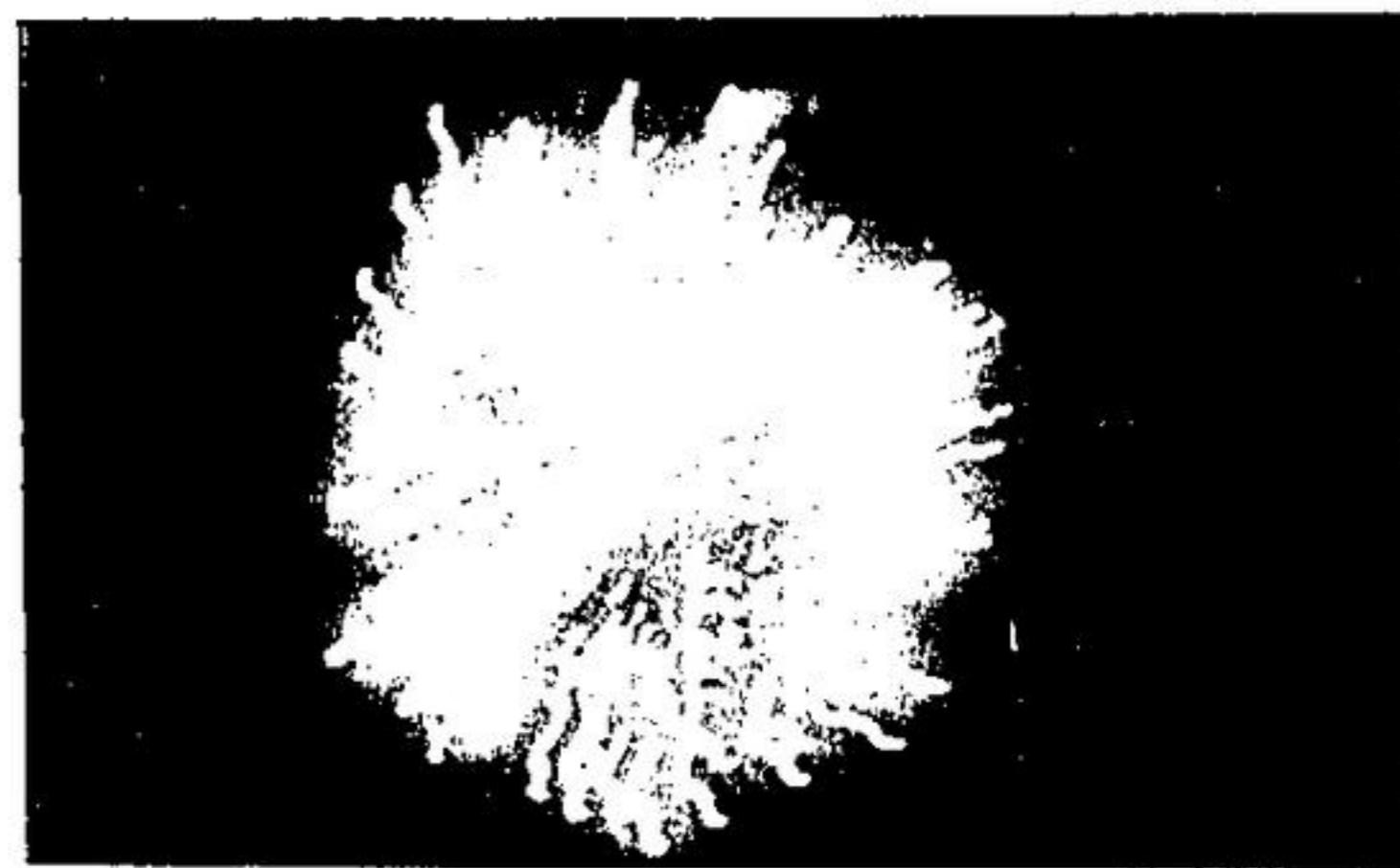
Classic cars were part of the Canada Day parade at Glen Williams Main Street last Friday.

The cars were filled with local residents and politicians expressing their pride in being Canadian.

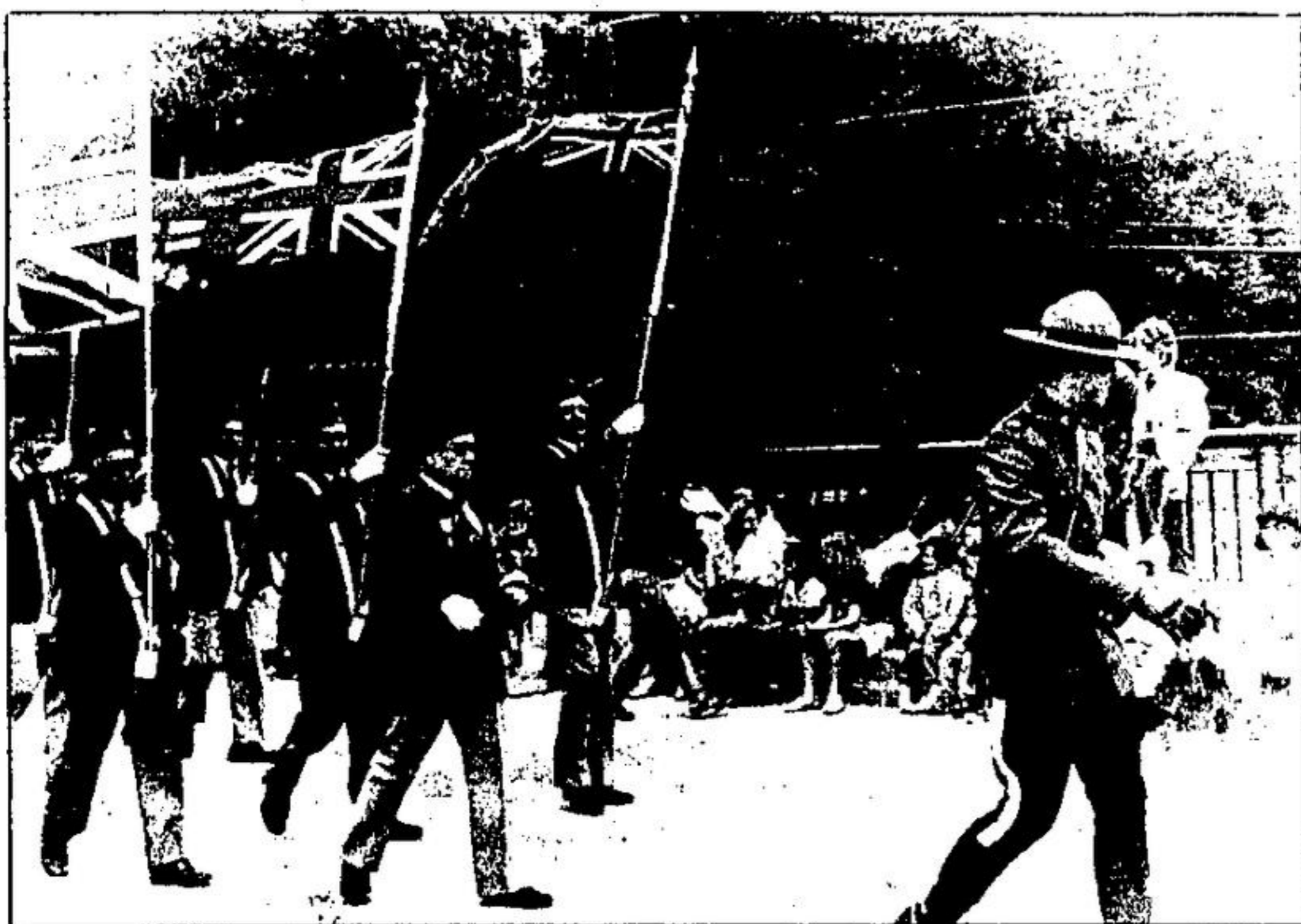
