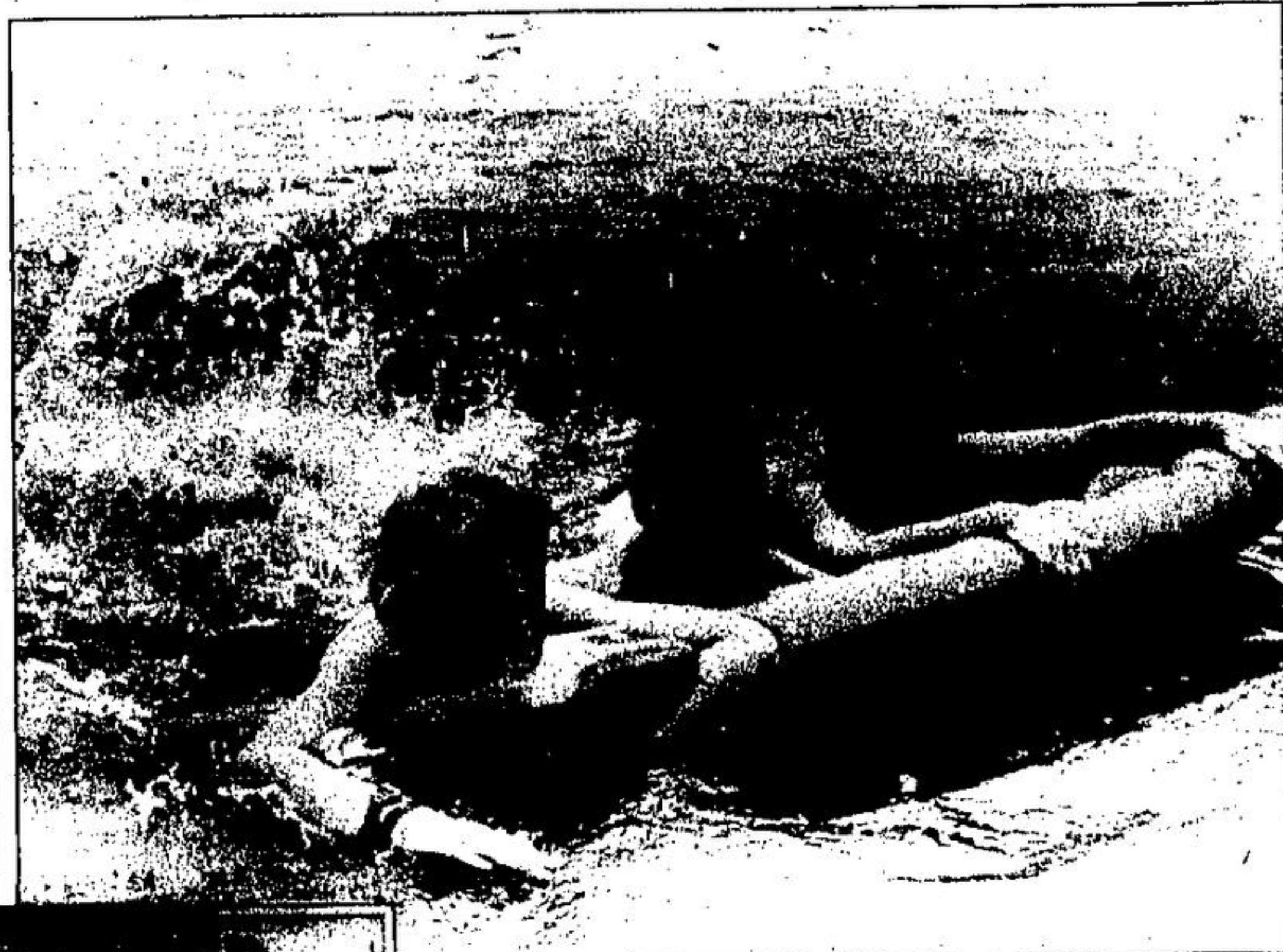


During the heatwave

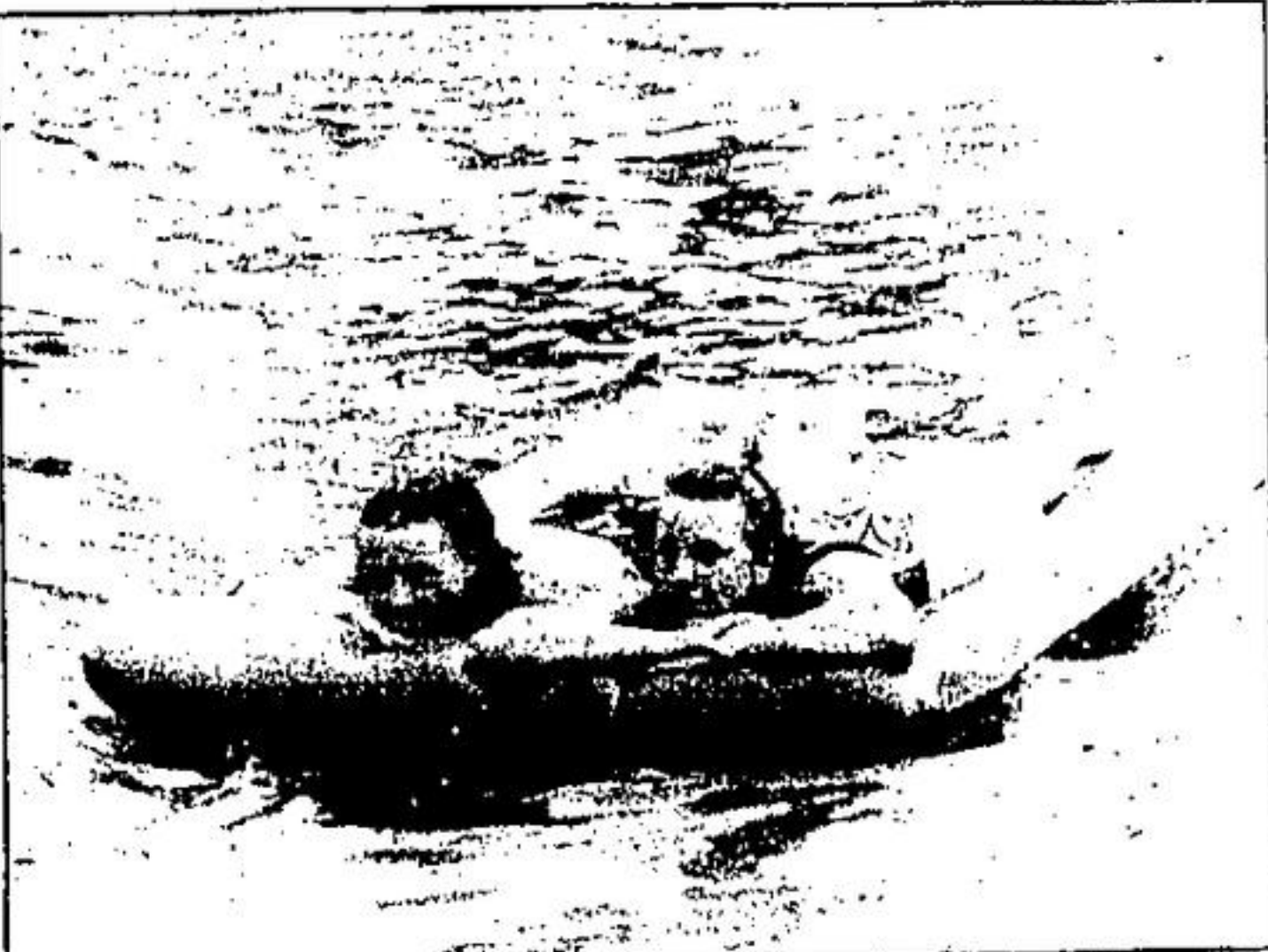


