

Can you read tires?

(NC) - Every tire bears an inscription written on the side indicating its specifications. Would you understand it? Take the Michelin Sport EP-X performance tire, for example. It reads P215/60 SR 14 EP-X. This inscription gives you various information:

- P: category of the tire, in this case "Passenger"
- 215: section width of tire in millimeters.
- 60: tire series (height/width) S: speed rating (S = up to
- 180 km/h)
- R: construction (radial) 14: wheel diameter in inches EP-X: product name

PRESSURE

Incorrect tire pressure can result in many problems: rapid and/or irregular tread wear, improper vehicle handling and reduced comfort due to overinflation or underinflation.


Tire pressure should be checked once a month and before a longdistance trip; always when tires are cold-before they have been driven on. Recommended pressure is usually indicated on the inside door panel or in the owner's manual.

Tire Rotation

The advised frequency of tire rotation depends on the type of tire. For example, Michelin tires should be totated only if irregular wear becomes apparent. Check your vehicle for any mechanical problems that could be responsible for this tread wear.

However, tires on front-wheeldrive vehicles-which wear out faster in the front-and all-season tires . should be rotated every 12,000 km. Front-to-rear or criss-cross rotation is recommended.

Today's tires are built for durability and maximum performance, and it is all too easy to forget about them once they have been mounted. For a safe ride, take good care of your tires.
