### Park improvements

To date, at this the mid-point in the summer season, the Town of Halton Hills Recreation and Parks Department has completed several park improvements projects including ball diamond fencing installations (Hornby Park), soccer field fencing installations (Elizabeth Drive Park), and creative play structures in co-operation with community groups (M.Z. Bennett Public School and Harrison Public School). Projects currently in progress or which have yet to be commenced include, a backstop installation and driveway reconstruction (Glen Williams Park), parking area improvements (Cedarvale Park), creative play structure installation (Greenore Park), and outfield fencing installation (Diamond 7 - Georgetown Fairgrounds).

Despite the number of improvement projects, the greatest visible impact on our parks this summer has been made by the weather. The unusually low rainfall this season has affected everything from plant growth to lake levels. Few park users have been unaffected by the consequences of the dry weather, and their understanding of these uncontrollable circumstances are appreciated by the Recreation and Parks Department.

### Sports Camp

The camp is being offered to enthusiastic players of all sports from age seven to 13. ## Big Fish contest is on

School's out and summer holidays have arrived! If the kids are already asking you for what-to-do ideas, why not make your next suggestion a pastime the whole family will enjoy?

Eligible contest species include muskellunge, speckled trout, lake trout, rainbow trout, brown trout, northern pike, smallmouth bass, largemouth bass, walleye and salmon.

The top fifteen anglers in each of the twenty classes receive a Berkley rod and reel combination, with cash awards of \$150, \$100 and \$50 for first, second and third place respectively. The first place angler in each class also receives an Evinrude electric fishing motor.

All Ontario-resident anglers 19 years of age or over who enter the contest automatically have one chance in the O.F.A.H. "any Fish Can Win" Grand Prize Draw. The Grand Prize is a 1983 Dodge Dakota pickup truck, a 15-foot Stryker bass boat and trailer, and a 70 horsepower Evinrude motor. Any species and any size of fish will qualify for this draw.

To enter the "Molson Export" Big Fish Contest in the Catch and Eat category, take a clear picture of your catch (side view), have two other people witness the weighing and measuring of the fish, then fill out an entry form. To enter the Live Release category, only one witness is required along with a photograph and the completed entry form. Send the completed entry form and photograph to the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters, Box 28, Peterborough, Ontario, K9J 6Y5.

Complete details are listed on "Molson Export" Big Fish Contest entry forms, available at all Stryker, Chrysler and Evinrude dealerships, Ontario lodges and resorts, Canadian Tire stores, from Molson representatives, or directly from the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters.
