## Chili cookers are hot

Four Georgetown men entered a chili cook-off for a laugh - and won!

Bert Cocks, Orval Snyder, Walt Jowett and John Collier put on their uniforms and got down to business at Thornbury, on Georgian Bay last month to take three prizes in a seasonal chili competition.

The four men, half of an eight-member Gourmet Club in Georgetown, said it was the first time they attempted making chili together.

"We never made chili as a group before the competition. As a matter of fact, it was so popular, I didn't get to try it," said Mr. Jowett.

The two gallons of chili cooked up for judges and patrons were made of beef, veal, onions, chili peppers, and spices, all paid for by Ferro Steel of

Georgetown. The judges loved the chili. The Gourmet Club was presented with "a very large trophy in the form of a chili pot," said Mr. Jowett.

Chili at the competition was limited to basic ingredients. No fillers such as kidney beans, corn, or green and red peppers were permitted in the recipe, said Bert Cocks' wife Barbara.

The chili team entered the contest when they saw an advertisement in

a local Meaford newspaper, and never really expected to win.

"We were pleasantly surprised, but we could see people liked our chili. Samplers during the day said it was the best-tasting," said Mr. Jowett.

Now it's on to more local chili competition. The team will bring their culinary skills to Campbellville for an Aug. 27 chili cook-off at the raceway.

## Local man killed

A Georgetown man was pronounced dead at hospital following a two-vehicle collision at Sideroad 5 and 10th Line Monday evening.

William V. Barclay, 62, of Marilyn Crescent, Georgetown, was rushed by ambulance to Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital where doctors pronounced him dead following an auto accident involving his

1985 Oldsmobile and a 1980 Chevrolet pick-up truck driven by a Hillsburgh man.

Halton police say the Oldsmobile was northbound on 10th Line and failed to stop for the intersection stop sign, striking the westbound truck.

The driver of the Chevrolet pick-up, James Mehlenbacher, 44, of Hillsburgh, was treated for minor injuries and released from Georgetown hospital.

The accident is still under investigation, Halton police say.

## Driver sought

Halton Regional Police are looking for the driver of a late-model car that struck a cyclist on Mountainview Road, Georgetown, on Wednesday.

The car, described as a 1986 or 1987 four-door dark grey Pontiac Sunbird, struck the cyclist on Mountainview Road as the car made a left turn onto Guelph Street, around 5:30 p.m., police say.

The cyclist, a 17-year-old Glen Williams youth, was taken to Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital where he was treated for minor injuries.

Halton police say the car could have a damaged left front area. They ask anyone with information about the driver's identity to call them at 878-8511, ext. 405.
