

Legion girls trounce local softball foes

Georgetown's Legion Girls softball team defeated Erin Gate 21-5 on Thursday, July 28 at Erin Gate.

Georgetown again played short-handed as they went with only eight players. Georgetown kept their infield intact as in the game with Sheridan the previous night. Lewis on third, Subject at short, Richardson at second, Dunn at first and Bouskill catching. Linda Bottero again did the pitching duties.

Georgetown scored four runs in the first inning as Bouskill and Bottero both singled and Teri Korzack drove them in with a triple. Cindy Dunn reached first on a walk and Susan Subject drove her in with a triple. Georgetown got one more in the second as Bouskill walked and Linda Bottero hit a triple to bring her in. Georgetown gave up three runs in the third on a couple of hits and an error.

Georgetown led 5-3 after three innings. In the fourth Bottero had the big bat as she sent the fielders for a run on her home run with no one on board. Georgetown got four more in the fifth and eleven in the sixth as Erin Gate fell apart. Erin Gate issued five walks and committed two errors in the inning and the Georgetown bats came alive. Georgetown gave up one run in the fifth and one in the sixth.

Linda Bottero pitched a fine game striking out seven and issuing no walks. Bottero also reached base six times on three singles, a triple, a homerun and a walk. Susan Subject reached base five times and made a fine catch in left field while playing short.

Teri Korzack and Toni McClements played the field and only allowed three balls to drop in Korzack triple in the first and McClements double in the sixth were key hits. McClements also stole second and third base in the fifth. Janelle Lewis reached base four times on two walks, a single and an error.

Georgetown's win gave them a bit of revenge as Erin Gate had

defeated them 18-8 a week earlier. Georgetown's next home game is Aug. 9 against Bloordale.

Linda Bottero pitched the game striking out 10 and issuing no walks as the Georgetown Legion girls softball team beat Sheridan 12-0 on July 27.

Georgetown played errorless ball in this game as they played with only eight players. The Georgetown girls played like they did at the start of the year hitting, fielding and running the bases.

Kara-Lynn Palmer and Toni McClements played the field and allowed only one ball to drop in as each fielder caught two fly balls apiece. Georgetown kept their infield intact as Janelle Lewis played third, Susan Subject stood at short, Richardson was at second, Cindy Dunn lined up at first and Tara Bouskill did the catching. They only allowed one ball to sneak through.

Georgetown allowed only one runner to reach third base. The only other runner of Sheridan was thrown out by Bouskill as she tried to steal second.

Cindy Dunn had a standout game at first base. Kara-Lynn Palmer reached base five times drawing three walks and two singles. Janelle Lewis reached base twice on walks but it was her sacrifice bunt in the third to move the runners from first and second to third and second that counted most as Bottero came up and hit a home run to clear the bases.

Richardson reached base three times scoring twice. Subject reached base twice scoring once. Bottero also reached base four out of five times while helping with four put outs.

The win helped Georgetown as they had lost to front runner Erin Gate 18-8 on July 19 in a backstreet game. As one coach put it, "their minds were not on playing ball." The only outstanding play of this game for Georgetown was made by Julie Anderson who belted another homerun.
