In pursuing an Acton location for these activities we have unfortunately come to the conclusion that none of the available facilities in Acton are wheelchair accessible. We are,

therefore, faced with the problems (and costs) of transportation to Milton or Georgetown. Other cost concerns could include rentals, supplies, refreshments, guest speakers or trips and possibly a part-time co-ordinator of this pro-




