Caron is employed with "Job Find" in Richmond Hill as a job coach, assisting handicapped people in finding regular jobs in the workplace. Caron is presently involved in guiding young clients through a 12-week course designed to choose appropriate occupations for its students.

The program, says Caron, has an 82 per cent success rate.

Caron's mother, Marlene Anderson from Nobleton, is a staff member of the Yellow Brick House in Aurora. The Yellow Brick House provides accommodation and food to homeless women and children for up to six to eight weeks. Marlene is the co-ordinator of the program which helps relocate these people after their departure from an emergency shelter.

Marlene spoke of the counselling and support given to the needy women and children.

Each of the speakers was presented with a gift for their part in making this an interesting meeting, which closed with lunch and a social hour.

The next Women's Institute meeting will be held at Hillcrest Church on Sept. 20, 7:30 p.m. Anyone interested is welcome to attend.

New works displayed at Peel Art Gallery

Let your imagination have free rein by visiting the Region of Peel Art Gallery to view the "hard edge" style paintings of artist Sheila Maki from Sept. 7 to Oct. 2, 1988.

She has been described as being a leader in the technique of "hard edge" - creating abstract shapes with sharply defined edges.

An internationally exhibited artist, she has taken her works to group and survey shows in some of the world's well known cities. These include Tokyo (Japan), Barcelona (Spain), Biella (Italy), Frechen (Germany), Boston (Mass.) and San Francisco (Calif.).

Sheila Maki's works are in many media. The exhibition, entitled "New Works", includes paintings, serigraphs and mixed media pieces.

In Ms. Maki's most recent pieces, there is an exciting tension in her use of forms which contrast with the serenity she creates with her subtle use of color.

Born in Sudbury, Ms. Maki's artistic skills are primarily self-taught. However, studies at the Camden Arts Centre in England and the University of British Columbia and various Toronto institutions aided the artist's development.

Ms. Maki's works are included in numerous public and corporate collections in Canada and the United States, including the Kitchener-Waterloo Art Gallery, the Hamilton Art Gallery, Oakville Centennial Gallery, the University of Toronto, the University of Waterloo and the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education.
