Hot fun in the summer time

Friends meet at summer programs

Summer camp is the place to meet friends for life, according to Parks and Recreation supervisor Peter Canazar.

"Friends are made so easily. These people (at the camp) came here in groups of two, and look at them now," he says of the group of teens, well-(amiliarized with one another after four days and neights of camping at Kelso Park.

"they've done a bit of everything," said supervisor Debbie Sunnucks, a graduate of Queen's University who begins teaching this fall. The teens participate in horseback riding, golfing, roller skating, windsuring and a trip to Wonderland. "They don't have time to get bored," she said.

The weeklong camp, designed to instill leadership and group contact, is in its trial year and has done amazingly well, sald Peter.

"We had to turn people away because it's such a structured camp." The ceiling number on the camp was 15, said Peter, but they allowed 16 - eight girls and eight

And the weeklong camp is just one of the possibilities for Halton Hills children and teens looking for summer recreation. The Parks and Recreation Department also presented a Theatre Camp where asplring actors and writers hone their dramatic skills, two sports camps, one in Acton, one in Georgetown, a leadership development program with 32 participants this summer, and three to four camps running all season for a total

of 10 to 12 camps, said Peter. Enrolment in these camps has increased dramatically in the last two summers, he said. "People signing

up for the camps - it's just gone crazy" There were over 1,000 people signing up last year, and the figures indicate an even higher enrolment this year, said Peter.

Peter, a Recreation student in a co-op program at the University of Waterloo, was a counsellor before 1986 when he became a supervisor with Parks and Rec.

Peter will leave the department after this summer to continue his education, and though he'll no longer be in town, he said, he knows he has "friends in Georgetown."

Approval granted for NEC acquisition

Natural Resources Minister, Vincent G. Kerrio, has announced the approval of an additional Niagara Escarpment land acquisition project of the Halton Region Conservation Authority.

The Niagara Escarpment Plan approved by the provincial government on June 14, 1985, identified the need for continued acquisition of important Niagara Escarpment lands in order to protect and provide public access to this major resource.

In accordance with the Niagara Escarpment Plan, the Conservation

Authority proposes to acquire lands close to Mount Nemo Conservation Area, an existing Niagara Escarpment Conservation Area, and their Administrative Office in order to secure the route of the Bruce Trail.

The funds for the acquisition of this land will be provided by the Ningara Escarpment Trust Fund administered by the Ontario Heritage Foundation. These funds may be supplemented by municipal levies and donations from the private sector.


