Expectant mothers need not worry

Planning for a new addition to the family is a happy time for everyone. The last thing an expectant mother wants to worry about is how to collect maternity benefits while she is off work. Hopefully, this article will alleviate some of those worries, and answer a few questions.

To be eligible for maternity benefits, a woman must experience an interruption of earnings. That is, she must have her earnings reduced by at least 40 per cent. As well, she must have at least 20 weeks of insurable employment in her qualifying period, and she must supply a medical from her doctor as proof of her pregnancy.

Once a claim for maternity benefits is established, the future mother must serve a two-week waiting period (for which no benefits are payable). She is then eligible to be paid 15 weeks of maternity benefits, providing she meets the

eligibility criteria. Benefits are paid at a rate of 60 per cent of normal weekly insurable earnings. As mentioned in a previous article, a claim for benefits runs in three phases. Maternity benefits are only payable in the first (or initial) phase, so if a woman has already collected other benefits, her entitlement to maternity benefits could be reduced.

Generally, maternity benefits can begin eight weeks prior to the expected or actual date of delivery, and be paid up to 17 weeks after the expected or actual date of birth. This gives a lot of flexibility for someone making a claim.

Remember, maternity benefits are not automatic. The time to file a claim is immediately after the last day of work. Often times the "blessed event" is hard to predict, so obtain an application and medical certificate ahead of time, and have everything ready to go in case of a surprise! And don't delay in filing your claim because you don't have your Record of Employment. That can be supplied after you actually


