Kristensen-Irvine nets spot in Laurier Hall of Fame

Kyra Ann Kristensen-Irvine, a resident of Georgetown, was one of six people to be inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame at Wilfrid Laurier University in Waterloo Friday.

The 39-year-old physical education teacher at Sir John A. Macdonald senior public school was honored at a reception and dinner.

Kristensen-Irvine, who played basketball at Waterloo Lutheran University (the forerunner of Laurier) from 1967 to 1971, was recognized as the person contributing the most to athletics in 1970.

She was team captain in 1969 and 1970. From 1968 to 1970, she was on the executive of the university's Women's Athletic Association and in 1971, she served as president.

Kristensen-Irvine was also sports editor of the 1971 yearbook and sports editor and photographer for the campus newspaper from 1969 to 1971.

She has been active in Georgetown community sports, including softball and squash, and coached the disabled in track and field.

Kristensen-Irvine plays regularly in the Georgetown Ladies Basketball League.
