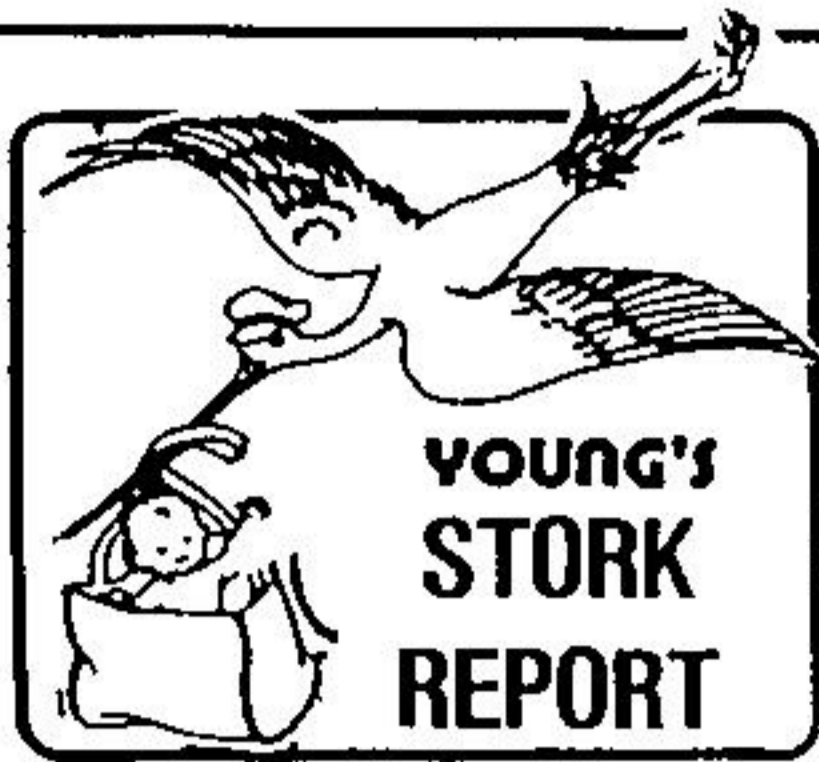

## RAILROAD FEVER 1851

The Guelph Advertiser of October 9, 1851 reports that a trial line has already been run at 43 miles through Brampton, Norval, Georgetown, Acton and Guelph. Company stock is 250,000 Pounds at 5 Pounds a share. It is hoped that the townships will buy a large number of shares.

The station in Acton was about midway between Mill and Queen Streets. At the east end of the station were the cattle yards, oil and freight sheds. Wood was used as fuel for the engines. The passengers had to walk along the tracks, past the water tank which was located near Mill Street. The water tank provided icy walking conditions in winter and the water dripage spoiled many a lady's hat in summer when she inadvertently walked too near the tank.
