Canada's top five and 10-pin bowlers are striking it rich with the return of the \$64,000 Pins Game to TSN.

Every Wednesday at 8 p.m. Jim Van Horne calls the action with expert analysts Greg Koch on the five-pin competition, and Frank Sisson on the 10-pin programs from Superbowl in Newmarket, Ontario. The season of hour-long programs culminates with semi-finals and finals in November and January.

Georgetown's own Bill Anderson is a featured competitor in the Pins Game and can be seen live on TSN on Oct. 26 as he goes pin-for-pin with Michel Charron of Quebec.

The Pins Game has money riding on each frame, with bowlers battling in a one-game sudden death play. In the first games, \$50 will be up for grabs in each frame (10 per game), with \$100 offered in the quarter finals, \$200 in the semi-finals and \$400 in the championship finals.

This will be the showcase for 64 of the country's best competitors, including Terry Stewart of Saskatoon, last year's ladies' Pins Champion, and former Canadian 10-pin champion Trevor Peters of Brandon, Manitoba. Some of the colorful bowlers new to the series include Calgary's Dave Alexander whose daughter changed her wedding date to allow Dave to compete, 15-year-old Jodi Craig of Sarnia, the youngest-ever competitor and Saskatoon's Corinne Berezowski whose sister Leanne won the 1987 10-pin event.
