

Police beat

Cyclist thrown

Police say a cyclist was ejected from his bike after it struck a stopped car in Acton Saturday. Police say the 12-speed Free Sport driven by 15-year-old Jeffrey Martin Koprowski received light damage when it struck a 1986 Ford Mustang driven by a Mississauga woman on Mill Street near Frederick Street. No charges were laid and police report no injuries.

Boy injured

An Acton boy, 9, was in satisfactory condition Monday at Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital after his bicycle was struck by a car Saturday afternoon. Police say Brad Cutler of Acton received major injuries when his bicycle failed to stop at the Church Street and Willow Street intersection and he was hit by a 1986 Oldsmobile. The driver of the Oldsmobile, a 41-year-old Acton man, was uninjured in the incident and his car was moderately damaged. No charges have been laid.

Charge laid

An Acton man was charged with five driving offences following a collision with a hydro pole Friday night on Fourth Line near Sideroad 17. Police say a 1970 Chevrolet Sierra was severely damaged when it went out of control, after failing to stop at the Fourth Line and Sideroad 17 intersection, and struck a hydro pole on the west side of Sideroad 17. Both the driver and a passenger, a Rockwood man, 22, received minor injuries in the accident. An Acton man, 26, is charged with driving while under suspension, careless driving, driving without auto insurance, driving without licence plates and a Criminal Code of Canada charge of driving while prohibited by law.

Both men were treated and released from Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital.

Vehicles collide

A driver, operating a vehicle with a learner's permit was charged with following too closely in connection with a collision Oct. 29. Police say a 1978 Chevrolet struck a 1986 Volkswagen Jetta from behind at Guelph Street near Mountainview Road Thursday around noon. Both cars were severely damaged. An Acton man, 52, driver of the Jetta, received minor injuries in the accident.

Truck spill

A gravel truck spilled its load in a single-vehicle accident on Sideroad 17 near Fourth Line Monday morning. Police say a 1985 Mack truck owned by an Erin haulage company flipped on its side around 8:30 a.m., spilling three-quarter inch crushed stone on the roadway.

\$500 damage

Police say a BB gun or air pistol fired at a Charles Street, Georgetown home resulted in \$500 damage to the front window. The holes in the window were discovered Sept. 28.

Window smashed

A pellet rifle fired at Park Public School in Georgetown Sept. 27 or 28 resulted in \$300 damage, say police. Two gymnasium windows were shattered by shots. Police are continuing to investigate.

To appear

A Georgetown man has been charged by Halton police with possession of a narcotic and intoxication in a public place. Police say a man was discovered unconscious at 3:25 a.m., Oct. 1 at the Guelph Street and Main Street intersection and several marijuana cigarettes and a small quantity of hashish were found. The 26-year-old Georgetown man will appear in court Nov. 14.

Car damaged

The tail lights of a 1983 Oldsmobile were smashed on Church Street in Acton, Oct. 1. Police say damage estimated at \$135 was caused around 10:30 a.m. by an unknown object striking the vehicle.

Impaired charge

Police have charged a Brampton man with impaired driving after they sighted a car driving "at a high rate of speed" Saturday night. A car travelling on Highway 7 east of Winston Churchill Boulevard at 10:35 was stopped and charges were laid. The 25-year-old man will appear in court Oct. 31.

Cigarettes taken

Police say a taxi company in Acton was broken into Oct. 1. An unknown suspect damaged the door but took only a small quantity of cigarettes.

Woman injured

A Milton woman, 56, was injured in an industrial accident south of Norval Oct. 29. The woman, an employee of Maple Lodge Farms, slipped off a stepladder, hitting her back against a steel sink, say police. Elaine Smyth of Ontario Street, Milton, was treated and released from Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital after she sustained minor injuries in the accident.

Truck damaged

The window of a 1984 pickup truck was broken when a pumpkin was thrown through it Oct. 2. Halton Regional Police say \$300 damage was caused to the windshield of the vehicle parked on Ewing Street, Georgetown.

Elliott calls misdeal on full house issue

Houses with more than one family living in them are becoming a problem in Acton, Ward 1 Coun. Norm Elliott says.

Coun. Elliott has received complaints about more than one family living in some houses in residential areas from citizens who think the situation is "eroding the integrity of the neighborhood."

There have been reports of two or three families living in one house and more than eight cars outside a home, said Coun. Elliott.

Surrounding residents "feel the zoning restrictions are being ig-

nored," he said.

Coun. Elliott acknowledged enforcing a bylaw such as the one Markham recently passed restricting the number of unrelated people living in a household might hurt the affordable housing situation.

"Do zoning bylaws mean anything? Should they be enforced?" he asked.

Councillors instructed town staff to investigate the details on zoning, past records of those zoning violations and the present status of the town enforcement policy.

Lorne Scots show colors

PART OF WINSTON CHURCHILL BOULEVARD TO BE CHANGED TO OLD PINE CREST ROAD

PUBLIC NOTICE OF CHANGE OF STREET NAME

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton proposes to enact a by-law pursuant to Paragraph 105 of Section 210 of the Municipal Act to change the name of part of the road allowance between the former Township of Chinguacousy and the former Township of Esquering from Winston Churchill Boulevard to Old Pine Crest Road. The part of the road allowance that will be subject to the name change is described as follows:

The land situated in the City of Brampton, in the Regional Municipality of Peel (formerly in the Township of Chinguacousy, County of Peel), being the part of the road allowance between the Township of Chinguacousy and the Township of Esquering, more particularly described as follows:

PREMISING that the easterly limit of the road allowance between the Township of Chinguacousy and the Township of Esquering has a bearing of North 44 degrees 11 minutes 55 seconds West and relating all bearings herein thereto:

Commencing at the southerly angle of Lot 12, Concession 6, West of Hurontario Street, in the former Township of Chinguacousy;

THENCE South 38 degrees 32 minutes 40 seconds West 66 feet to a point in the westerly limit of the said road allowance, said point being the easterly angle of Lot 12, Concession 11, in the former Township of Esquering;

THENCE north 44 degrees 11 minutes 55 seconds West along the westerly limit of the said road allowance 1035.2 feet to a standard iron bar located at the point where the westerly limit of the said road allowance intersects the southerly limit of the By-law Road known as Adamson Street as described in Township of Esquering By-law 372 registered April 16, 1885 in the Land Registry Office for the Registry Division of Halton as instrument No. 4372.

THENCE North 38 degrees 32 minutes 40 seconds East 66 feet to a point in the easterly limit of the said road allowance;

THENCE South 44 degrees 11 minutes 55 seconds East 1035.2 feet along the easterly limit of the said road allowance to the point of commencement.

A map showing the location of the said part of the road allowance may be inspected at the office of the Clerk during normal business hours.

The proposed by-law will come before Council for consideration at its regular meeting in the Council Chambers at the municipal offices, 150 Central Park Drive, Brampton on the 12th day of October, 1988, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon, and at that time, the council will hear any person who claims that he will be adversely affected by the by-law and who applies to be heard.

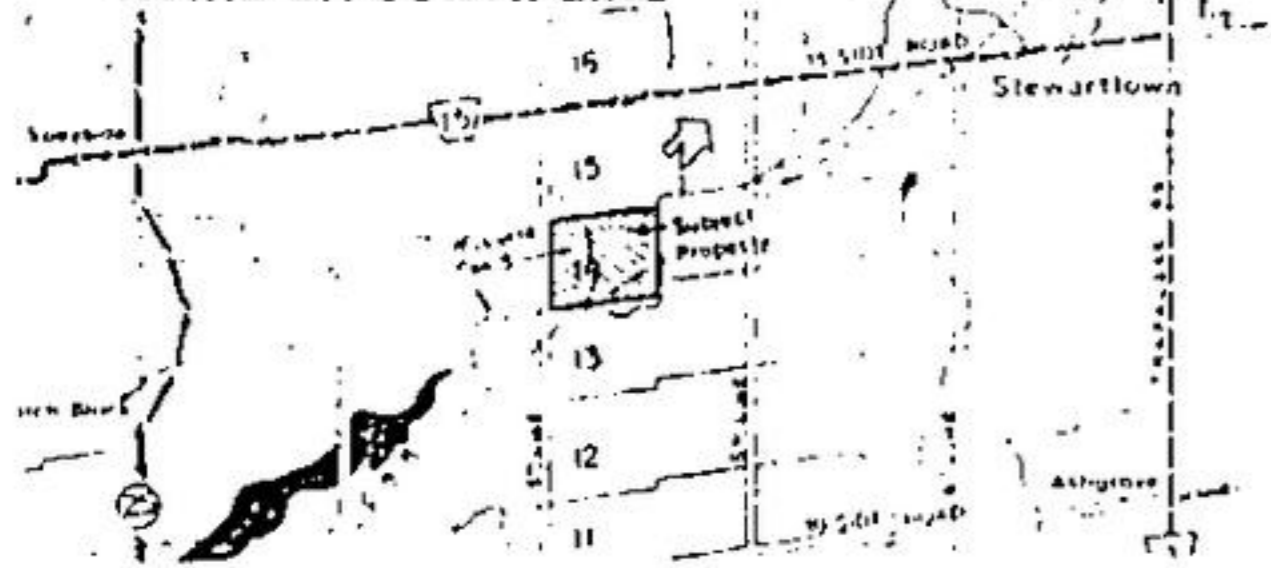
