The Georgetown Tri-county Bantam hockey team travelled to Burlington on Oct. 3 for their second encounter of the 1988-89 hockey season after losing their season opener on Oct. 1 against Erin.

The first period of the Oct. 3 game was played to a draw, with eight penalties called (five Burlington, three Georgetown). Both teams had good scoring chances, but couldn't capitalize on any of their powerplay opportunities.

In the second period Georgetown came out flying and applied excellent pressure throughout, they were met however by the hot hand of the Burlington goaltender Burlington's Brad Frost alone in front of goaltender Mark St. Pierre, opened the scoring at 6:51 on a pass from Daryl Simon behind the goal. Georgetown evened the score at 12:21 on a shorthanded goal by Steve Brown assisted by Dave Humphries

and Jake Poulstrup. Burlington went ahead again at 13:43 with Darren Wilkins jamming in a goalmouth scramble. There were 12 penalties handed out in this period, six aside.

The third period action was end to end with good goaltending at both ends. There were seven penalties assessed (three Burlington, 4 Georgetown) but the powerplays remained ineffective. Georgetown tied the game a second time with only 1:24 left to play on a good line change that caught Burlington doing the same. The goal scored by Bob Dezeew was assisted by Troy Gardner. Less than 31 seconds later, Philip Klager scored the winner for Burlington from Darren Wilkins and Brad Snyder on a bullet from the top of the circle. This was an entertaining hockey game with an excellent effort by the entire Georgetown squad. This team is going to provide some surprises this season.

Goaltenders Seth Homer and Darryl Casselman shared the goaltending, and both played well. Defenceman Derek Ruffolo and Blaine Kennedy blocked shots in their support. Hay and Matt Deruchie led the team with 10 takeouts between them.
