

Georgetown unbeaten in three

Big start for Bantam reps

The Georgetown "AA" Bantams enjoyed a strong start to the hockey season with two wins and a tie in their first three games.

Coaches Rick Hume and Brian James are pleased with the scoring punch of their charges, who have outscored the opposition 20-5 to this point in the season.

In the first game of the schedule Georgetown hosted Flamboro and trounced the opposition 8-2.

The bantam squad travelled to Milton for game two and in true Georgetown-Milton fashion the match resulted in a 2-2 tie.

In game three Dundas visited Georgetown and were overwhelmed by the locals to the tune of 10-1.

In game one against Flamboro Georgetown jumped into a quick lead with goals from Adam Hagen, unassisted, and Ken Kosziwka from

Hills and Curry.

In period two Georgetown exploded with four goals: two by Elinesky, one by Lewis and Kosziwka who netted his second of the contest.

Flamboro countered with a single to round out the scoring at 6-1 after two.

The last period was highlighted by Elinesky's third goal of the game while Shaun Curry scored once to complete the Georgetown scoring with assists going to Hills and Wright. Flamboro scored once in the third to run the final score to 8-2 in favour of the local majors.

At Milton in game two of the season the fans were expecting a game typical of the strong rivalry that exists between the two clubs and they were not disappointed. Although Georgetown outshot the opposition 35-17 they could only

manage a tie against the physical Milton squad.

Milton scored the only goal of the first period with Georgetown tying the score at 6:46 of the second period on a shot from Adam Hagen assisted by Kosziwka.

Milton regained the lead late in the period to take them into the final frame with a one goal lead. Georgetown poured 17 shots at the Milton net in the final period but could only generate one goal when Doug Crawford converted an Elinesky rebound to tie the match at 2-2.

Game three against Dundas was a penalty-filled contest in which Georgetown demonstrated their awesome scoring ability. The locals scored twice in the first with an unassisted goal from Sean Guistini and one from Duane Lewis from

Hills and Amato.

Georgetown found the mark five more times in the second period with two from Brad Amato and one each from Guistini, Hills and Wright. Assists went to Lee (2), Lewis (2) with Kosziwka, Amato, Wright, Curry and Crawford with singles.

The third period saw Georgetown sting the Dundas squad with three more goals from Lewis, Kosziwka and Guistini, who completed his hat-trick. Assists went to Hagen, Amato, McIntyre and Lang.

The Georgetown major Bants' cager duo of Katsiliteris and Downs turned in solid performances between the pipes in allowing only five goals in three games and promise to frustrate sharp shooters around the league this season.

Two tough losses for Peeewe B's

Last weekend the Georgetown Major B Peeewe lost a couple of games that they could have won, as they lost 5-3 on Saturday to Brampton Pizza Pizz, and 5-1 on Sunday to Burlington Data Graphics Design.

Saturday's exhibition game with Brampton was a result of a postponement of the league game with Erin. In the first, the locals put Brampton under a lot of pressure, resulting in a number of good scoring chances. David Steer deflected Ryan Hay's point shot, but it hit the goalie's leg pad; Andrew Marshall had a drive from the slot, and

Mathew Anderson nearly cushed the rebound, and Keith Tippet and Matt Deruchie had good scoring chances. However, three defensive breakdowns led to two breakaways and a two-on-one, which Brampton converted into two goals. The period ended at 2-0.

There was no scoring in the second, but late in the period, a questionable five minute major for checking from behind put the locals at a disadvantage. Georgetown killed off the rest of the period, but Brampton scored 44 seconds into the third. Three minutes later, a re-

bound wasn't cleared, and the visitors made it 4-0.

Deruchie got the home side back in the game, scoring twice in one shift. On the first, Matt Lush set him up in the slot for a low glove side shot. And on the second, he beat the defenceman on a one-on-one and deked the goalie. After Brampton restored its three-goal lead, Georgetown got its final tally, when Tippet scored off a goalmouth scramble. Assists went to Deruchie and Lush. Final score, 5-3.

Sunday, the locals visited Burlington, and took a 1-0 lead into the

third, only to eventually lose 5-1. Matt Deruchie put the Georgetown side ahead with 3:57 to go in the first. After taking a pass from Matt Lush, he let a wrist shot fly from outside the blueline, that found the top stick side corner of the net.

Burlington pressured Georgetown for most of the game, and it was super goaltending by Darryl Casselman that kept the locals in the lead as long as it lasted. The home team finally tied it at 7:56 of the third. And three minutes later, just after Deruchie was stopped on a breakaway, a Burlington point shot hit a skate and deflected into the net past Casselman, to make it 2-1.

This seemed to take the wind out of the Georgetown sail and lifted the home team's spirits. They scored three goals in the last two minutes (one with the locals' goalie pulled for the extra attacker) to seal the victory.

Blaine Kennedy, Derek Ruffolo, Michael Travers and Shannon Morris blocked shots during the game, and Ryan Hay led in takeouts, with three.
